

THE PROTEST PETITION

Anyone desiring to file a written petition of protest intended to invoke the City Council's 3/4 majority vote rule must file such a petition with the City Clerk not later than three normal working days before the scheduled hearing date. For example, for hearings held on Monday, all protest petitions must be filed no later than 5:00 P.M. on the preceding Tuesday. The 3/4 majority rule requires that 3/4 of those eligible to vote among the City Council and Mayor must vote affirmatively in order for a petition to receive approval. The 3/4 majority rule may not apply to site plan amendments to conditional districts in some instances.
