Development of the site will be governed by the provisions of the Charlotte Zoning Ordinance and the provisions of this site plan, as well as other applicable codes and ordinances. The building and parking configuration shown on the site plan represents a firm plan for the development of the site but may be altered or modified during the design and development of the site within the maximum building and parking envelopes indicated as allowed per Section 6 of the Ordinance.

uffers, if required, will conform to the provisions of section 12.301. Required buffers on the site may he eliminated if the adjoining parcels are rezoned such that buffers are no longer required. Although not required, the Petitioner will establish a 25' Class 'C' buffer along the Duke Power line on the north side of the site. This buffer may be graded and re-vegetated to meet the Ordinance requirements. Screening will conform to the provisions of section 12.303. Landscaped areas within the site will be improved as part of the overall site development. All garbage/trash disposal areas, dumpsters, etc. will be screened with a solid enclosure and gates.

Stormwater detention will comply with applicable standards of Charlotte/Mecklenburg Stormwater Services. Common stormwater facilities may be used to comply with ordinance standards and may Access to the site will be provided by connections to Harris Blvd. and Technology Drive. These connections may be by way of either public streets or private streets or driveways. Internal access to

individual uses may be provided by way of either public or private streets. Public streets may be constructed to a special 'urban' street standard as has been approved by CDOT. In addition, the site has been arranged and planned to allow for the potential future extension of a street from this site to the west and the Petitioner will reserve a right-of-way for such a street, as generally shown on the site plan, through the design and development of the site. The Petitioner will install transportation improvements in conjunction with the development of the

Construct an additional eastbound left-turn lane on WT Harris Boulevard at Technology Drive.

The eastbound left-turn lanes will have 900 feet of total storage and a 20:1 bay taper or as

determined by CDOT. Construct a westbound right-turn lane on WT Harris Boulevard at Technology Drive with a storage length of 200 feet and a 20:1 bay taper.

Construct an additional southbound left-turn lane on Technology Drive at WT Harris Boulevard to provide a total dual left-turn storage length of 900 feet with a 15:1 bay taper and Bonievard to provine a total num sex-turn storage sengul of you less with a 15:1 buy super and 35:1 through lane transition taper(s) or as determined by CDOT.

Construct an additional westbound WT Harris Boulevard travel iane along the property frontage to tie into the existing right-turn lane at Medical Plaza Drive provided that sufficient area exists without having to extend the culvert. If the westbound lane cannot be constructed to Medical Plaza Drive without extending the culvert, then the lane (11-foot width) shall be constructed as far as possible beyond the site's proposed driveway and guardrail installed to tie into avisting amordical in conformance with NCDOT standards.

Continental Real Estate/Queens Properties is responsible for all costs associated with the design and construction of these improvements to include pavement markings and traffic control plans. Additionally, the developer is responsible for all costs associated with traffic signal modifications to include CDOT design costs, installation of new steel strain poles (if existing ones cannot be relocated),

loop detectors, and other related equipment. The design of all transportation improvements is subject to the review and approval of CDOT/NCDOT. In conjunction with the development of the retail, restaurant, health club, and up to 300

multifamily units, the Petitioner will construct improvements 2 and 4 prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for any building on the site. The petitioner will prepare detailed roadway improvement plans for all of the required improvements, which must be reviewed and approved by the appropriate transportation authority prior to any development in phase 2.

• In conjunction with any development of the site in excess of the noted above, the remainder of the improvements to Technology Drive and W.T. Harris Bird. will be installed, staid improvements to be completed prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for any building on the site included in this phase.

The petitioner will not be required to construct curb, gutter or sidewalk within the right-of-way of W.T. Harris Blvd. but will construct a sidewalk within an easement on the Petitioner's site that will be both part of the on-site pedestrian network and will link to the public rights-of-way or public sidewalks that may be installed adjacent to the site.

The Petitioner will use reasonable efforts to acquire the necessary right-of-way for the improvements to Technology Drive needed to accommodate intersection improvements and left turn receiving lanes. If the Petitioner is unable to acquire the necessary right-of-way at a commercially reasonable price without delaying the development of the site, The Petitioner will notify the City and the City will initiate appropriate proceedings to acquire the necessary right-of-way within 8 months of the Petitioner's notification. If the City of Charlotte is unable to acquire the necessary right-of-way then either the improvements will be modified or redesigned to metition the necessary right-of-way then either the improvements will be modified or redesigned to within the available right-of-way or the petitioner will be relieved of the improvement responsibility and will be permitted to proceed with the full development of the site without further restriction.

None of the foregoing provisions will prevent the Petitioner from completing any or all of the required improvements earlier than would be required to support the specific development phases on the site.

Parking will be provided at a rate that will meet or exceed the minimum requirements of the raning will be provided at a rate that will meet or exceed the minimum requirements of the ordinance. Within the site on internal streets, whether public or private, parallel parking will be permitted on both sides of the street and, in accordance with a commitment from the Planning Staff, this parallel parking will not be counted as "parking" for the purpose of application of the "400 foot rule" in the residential portions on the site. If parking structures are utilized, their floor area will not count against the floor area for the other structures on the site.

The proposed use of the site is for a mixed-use development including employment, retail and service, and multifamily uses. The site will be restricted against use for auto service stations, adult establishments, building material sales, and car washes.

Building height will comply with the provisions of the Zoning. Office buildings and the hotel will not

The Petitioner may place retail uses within office buildings on the site as well as within the retail center in order to further the mixed-use nature of the site. Retail floor area located within office retail space will be limited to 75% of the first floor area of the building and may only be located in multistory buildings of at least 15,000 square feet of total floor area.

The Petitioner reserves the right to exchange office floor area for residential units and visa versa at the rate of 100 dwelling units for 50,000 sq. ft. of office floor area. However, the office floor area may not be reduced below 200,000 sq. ft. In addition, the Petitioner may construct as few as three office buildings but will have the option to replace office buildings with residential buildings in the interior


