Council Member Ajmera:

Some of us – all members of the Cherry Neighborhood - have previously opposed the proposed Rezoning Petition 2018-078, most recently speaking against the petition at the City Council Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. Since that time Conformity Corp. (Petitioner) has re-submitted their site plan (revision 3) for the rezoning, and has been in direct contact with some immediate Cherry neighbors.

Mr. Ritchey stated to us and others present at the City Council meeting of September 24th that he would be in touch with the Cherry Neighborhood to further discuss the rezoning plans and the wishes of the Cherry Neighborhood. No outreach has been forthcoming from Mr. Ritchey or Conformity Corp. to the Cherry neighborhood, despite Mr. Ritchey's assurances that this would take place.

We in the neighborhood are both perplexed and alarmed that despite acknowledgement of the legitimacy of our concerns about the proposed plan by planning staff, City Council members, and members of the Zoning Committee, the plan continues to be advanced through the process.

Although density is the stated reason for the rezoning petition, the issue is not density. Parking is an issue, even in Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3. But it is not the only problem with the application.

After reviewing Conformity's Site Plan Revision 3, we continue to oppose the Rezoning Petition, for the following reasons:

1. Public Safety

The proposed 20' wide "Private Drive" or alley proposed by Conformity Corp. does not allow for the entry of City emergency vehicles to the houses along the proposed "private drive" if even one vehicle is parked along this alley. This is both unacceptable and unnecessary. The only reason for the narrowness of the proposed "private drive" is Conformity Corp.'s desire to permit the building of four residences, rather than the three that would be permissible under the current zoning. The existing Storm and Sanitary sewer easements and adjoining homes constrain the ability to put four homes on the parcel without squeezing the street width. We understand the motivation, but do not accept that rezoning is appropriate when the only beneficiary is the Applicant. It would set a terrible precedent – if allowed, every real estate speculator or developer will pursue the same solution.

We have included in this email following photos taken as recently as Tuesday, October 9, showing traffic challenges with current parking at Waco and Ellison Streets, which are both considerably wider than Conformity's proposed 20'.

2. Safety of the eventual homeowners on the "Private Drive"

At the impromptu discussion following the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th, we challenged Mr. Ritchey with the following observation: If you are the owner of a house built on the proposed Lot 1 (at the end of the alley), and you drive your car into your garage or parking apron, how will you get out again? Even assuming that there are no other cars parked on the "private drive", the street must be wide enough for the homeowner to turn around. Even a reverse K-turn requires that the street be wider than the length of the vehicle, unless the vegetation along the alley is to be continually sacrificed.

A typical large SUV or light duty pickup e.g. a full bed Ford F-150 is longer than 20'. (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List of longest consumer road vehicles). That means that the homeowner would have to back over 100' just to get out of his/her garage or, alternatively, back into the driveway of a neighbor's house. If the resident is towing a boat or work trailer, maneuvering is not possible.

This flies in the face of reasonableness, and is a safety hazard. Mr. Ritchey, when challenged with this observation, stated that a vehicle turn-around study would be done. Has this been done and reviewed by City planning staff? We also challenged Mr. Ritchey to come up with a plan that utilized a cul-de- sac to provide turnaround space for both City emergency vehicles and the residents of the new subdivision. He said he would do so. Has City planning staff received this?

3. Insufficient infrastructure

Charlotte Water Department declined to approve the rezoning based on insufficient sanitary sewer capacity to support an additional four houses. To our knowledge, this has not been addressed in Site Plan revision 3. Has City planning staff cleared this obstacle?

4. Appropriateness for the neighborhood.

Petitioner argues for the rezoning by citing the Saussy Burbank homes that have been built in Cherry over the past several years. Those parcels were rezoned to higher density to accommodate more houses. However, those houses front on public streets, not on narrow alleys as the Petitioner proposes. Typically, even in urban densities, the preference is to place dwellings on streets with the front of the dwelling facing the street, NOT an alley. This point was strenuously made by Ed McKinney in explaining the reasons for not approving Revolve Residential's rezoning request in NoDa at the October 24 City Council zoning meeting. There is nothing else like this in Cherry. It would be unfortunate if this rezoning were approved, which would set a precedent for shoehorning new single-family houses into private alleys. There are follow-on issues of private alley maintenance, lighting, planting and more. Are "Private Drives" to be the future direction for Charlotte infill development?

5. No commitment to a Tree Save area between Lot 4 and Scott Baynes' property.

Mr. Ritchey stated, immediately following the September 24th meeting, that a future connection to Welker Avenue was possible. He also stated in the rezoning hearing of September 24th that the easement for the sanitary sewer line in this area had been improperly recorded. Hence utilizing this space for Tree Save was not possible.

Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3 shows "potential tree save area" of 5590 sf. None of that is in the area between Lot 4 and immediate neighbor Scott Bayne's property, where it is most needed. Much of the 5590 sf indicated as "potential tree save area" is already in the SWIM/PCSO buffer area, and hence is double counted. In any case only 2524.30 sf – less than half the amount shown on Conformity's Site Plan Revsion 3 - will actually be used. Logically the 2524.30 sf would be used between Lot 4 as shown and Scott Baynes' property. The SWIM/PCSO buffer already take care of tree save in that buffer.

Petitioner has stated during the rezoning process that it is keeping its options open for either a future fifth lot or a connection to other future lots. We cannot see how an implied fifth lot could be created without building over either a storm or sanitary sewer. This area should preferably have a conservation easement given its proximity to the creek and sewer lines running through it. Has Planning staff reviewed the alleged improper recordation of the sanitary sewer easement?

Conformity's rezoning plan, as shown on Revision 3, is no better, and in some ways worse, than Revision 2, discussed at the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. At this point we have little confidence that what have heard the whole truth from Conformity, since they have told us multiple, conflicting tales.

No one is challenging the merit or desirability of developing the parcel in question. What we do question is the continued lack of specificity and consistency from Conformity, and the fundamental basis for a rezoning of the parcel.

We believe that Conformity can put together a subdivision plan that meets the needs of both the Cherry neighborhood and the long-term goals of the City of Charlotte. However, we do not believe that residents of the City of Charlotte have an obligation to approve a substandard rezoning application solely to enrich Conformity Corp.

We recommend that the Rezoning Application be rejected, and further recommend that Petitioner meet with both interested Cherry residents and appropriate City planning staff, simultaneously, to discuss what alternatives are available.

Council Member Ajmera:

I am writing to request that Rezoning Request 18-078, affecting Waco and Ellison Streets in the Historic Cherry neighborhood, not be approved until the developer responds to neighbors' specific concerns about the planned development. Said concerns, only some of which were documented in the attached notes from developer Monty Ritchey's meeting with residents on August 2, 2018, have not been addressed in his revised plan. They are as follows.

- 1. The developer plans to build a 20 foot private drive rather than reopen the abandoned portion of Waco Street as a full-sized street. On this private drive, which will not be accessible by emergency vehicles, sanitation trucks, or construction vehicles, he plans to build four 4-5 bedroom houses with single car garages. Charlotte Fire Department's comment on the rezoning request was "No parking on streets less than 26 clear width." This infrastructure is obviously inadequate and it will create major on-street parking problems on Waco and Ellison, which are already narrow and sometimes impassable for school buses sanitation trucks.
- 2. Charlotte Water comments regarding the development were as follows. does not concur with the rezoning based upon the limited project information available. It is recommended that the applicant contact the Charlotte Water New Services at (704) 432-2854 for further information and to discuss options regarding sanitary sewer system capacity. developer plans to develop a 20 ft wide private driveway instead of reopening the existing abandoned Waco Street a full-sized street. On this private drive, which will not be accessible by emergency vehicles, sanitation trucks, or construction vehicles, he plans to build four 4-5 bedroom houses with single car garages. Charlotte Fire Department's comment on the rezoning request was "No parking on streets less than 26 clear width." This infrastructure is obviously inadequate and it will create major on-street parking problems on Waco and Ellison, which are already narrow and sometimes impassable for school buses sanitation trucks.
 - 1. Charlotte Water Department's comments were as follows:

The proposed rezoning is located in an area that Charlotte Water has determined to have limited sanitary sewer system capacity. Charlotte Water does **not** concur with the rezoning based upon the limited project information available. It is recommended that the applicant contact the Charlotte Water New Services at (704) 432-2854 for further information and to discuss options regarding sanitary sewer system capacity proposed rezoning is located in an area that Charlotte Water has determined to have limited sanitary sewer system capacity.

2. Solomon Fortune noted in his staff comments that Lot 5 will be used for Tree Save **and** would be able to be used for another lot in the future. But the two statements seem contradictory based upon Section 21-93 of the General Tree Save requirements (subsection e):

(e) No structure will be allowed within ten (10) feet of the tree save area. A building restriction must be noted on the record plat in accordance with the Tree Ordinance Guidelines.

- 3. When the community met with the developer he admitted that he had not given any thought to the placement of trash dumpsters since sanitation vehicles would be unable to pick them up curbside for the four houses. Neighbors requested that he not create trash receptacle pick up/storage bins at the front of the development, but this is precisely what he is planning for
- 4. Similarly, neighbors requested that the developer place a communal mail kiosk at the rear of the development rather than at the front. He has declined to incorporate that request as well.
- 5. The developer acknowledged that he will be removing trees at the rear of the development that currently provide a visual and noise buffer between the homes on Baldwin and Waco and the business establishments and parking lot in Kings Court. We requested that he not remove the trees but he has not honored that request.

I have attached a picture of Ellison Street with cars parked on both sides of the street, taken just today. The measured distance between the two cars parked directly across from each other is a mere 13 feet, not wide enough for a garbage truck or a school bus to pass.

The reality is that the developer, in requesting approval of smaller lot sizes via less setback, is attempting to shoehorn four houses in a space that actually should accommodate no more than three. His original request was for *five* smaller lots, from which he was only dissuaded because of the sewage lines that run below that proposed fifth lot. Our understanding is that he is now contemplating using that lot as a parking pad for parking overflow for the four homeowners - yet another eyesore for the residents on that corner and in contradiction with the alleged Tree Save referenced above.

We appreciate the time that Planning staff took to meet with us and we understand the legal constraints limiting what they can and cannot say in support of our concerns. We only ask that for once, common sense, good planning, and the legitimate concerns of existing residents be balanced against developers' profits.

COMMUNITY MEETING REPORT

Petitioner: Monte Ritchey / Conformity Corp.

Rezoning Petition No. 2018-078

This Community Meeting Report is being filed with the Office of the City Clerk and the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission pursuant to the provisions of the City of Charlotte Zoning Ordinance.

PERSONS AND ORGANIZATIONS CONTACTED WITH DATE AND EXPLANATION OF HOW CONTACTED:

A representative of the Petitioner mailed a written notice of the date, time and location of the Community Meeting to the individuals and organizations set out on <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto by depositing such notice in the U.S. mail on July 23, 2018. A copy of the written notice is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u>.

DATE, TIME AND LOCATION OF MEETING:

The Community Meeting was held on Thursday, August 2, 2018 at 6:00 pm at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, 517 Baldwin Avenue, Charlotte, NC 28204.

PERSONS IN ATTENDANCE AT MEETING (see attached copy of sign-in sheet):

The Community Meeting was attended by those individuals identified on the sign-in sheet attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C.</u> The Petitioner was represented at the Community Meeting by Monte Ritchey ("Ritchey") and Laura Nightingale ("Nightingale").

SUMMARY OF PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION:

The Petitioner's agent, Ritchey, welcomed the attendees and introduced the Petitioner's team. Ritchey indicated that the Petitioner proposed to rezone an approximately 0.74 acre site (the "Site") located at the end of Waco Street, near S. Kings Drive from the R-6 zoning district to UR-2(CD) zoning district. Ritchey explained the rezoning process in general and stated that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the rezoning request and the conditional site plan and respond to questions and concerns from nearby residents and property owners.

Ritchey then presented the site plan and pointed out various commitments made by the Petitioner. Ritchey briefly discussed how the lots proposed are laid out, the nature of the newly proposed private street/drive and the principal reason for the request. He stated that the principal reason for the request was to reduce the lot width requirement and that the lots were otherwise dimensionally compliant with the current zoning, R-6. He used the site plan submitted as part of the Petitioner's original submittal.

S. Bayne:

Q: Will there be 5 houses built? Does the application ask for 4 or 5 houses?

A: No, there will only be 4 houses.

Q: Is the Petitioner doing anything with Lot 5?

A: No. Nothing is planned as of now. Long term hold.

Q: How wide will the private road be?

A: 23 feet wide with a 4 foot sidewalk.

Q: Where will the owners of these houses park?

A: There will be a 1 car garage and a 20 feet deep driveway.

Q: What about additional parking for guests, multiple vehicles, etc.?

A: Will consider guest parking bays at the end of private street drive, if room. Will consider flaring drive pad to two cars.

R. Jacobs:

Q: What will be the SF of the houses? How many bedrooms?

A: Petitioner cannot answer. The houses will be built by an in-town builder. The houses will fit into the 32x65 footprint. Likely 4-5 bedrooms.

Q: Will Lot 5 be a cut through?

A: Potentially. But there are no plans for it now or near future. Would require other parcels that the Petitioner does not own or have negotiated. Petitioner volunteered that the city has requested that Lots 4 & 5 be combined.

Q: Would you have to cross the creek to get to Henley?

A: Yes, which would be very expensive due to bridge requirements (Army Corps of Engineers, etc.).

P. Allen:

Q: Can the Petitioner give an overview/comparison of setbacks to the other houses on Waco Street?

A: The other houses are likely 20 ft setbacks. These will be 14 ft setbacks; however, the streetscape will still work nicely.

Q: What are the side yards?

A: 5 feet side yards are a requirement of our plan due to the notes that we've placed on it. R-6 also requires 5 foot side yards.

Q: What are the rear yards?

A: Only 10' is required, but Petitioner anticipates at least 30 feet, due to the grade change from the logical building locations to the creek.

S. Bayne:

Q: What will happen to the trees in back?

A: Petitioner will not be working in that area and as a result, they will be saved. The Petitioner can compel the builder to keep those trees.

D. Sucherman:

Q: Concerned about the buffer next to Lot 1. Will they remove the trees?

A: Cannot answer definitively, but with only a 5'sideyard, it is more likely that only a hedgerow will be used. Petitioner can work to buffer the view to the Shopping Center at the end of the private drive however with either trees or architecture.

Q: What about city services like trash?

A: There will not be a dumpster. There will be roll outs (4 trash, 4 recycle). Concerns about having a bunch of cans on the road. Petitioner may be able to provide some screening.

Q: Where will the mailboxes be?

A: There will be a cluster box/kiosk, as now required by Post Office. Petitioner to show mail facility on plans.

P. Allen:

Q: How many houses are allowed in current zoning/by right?

A: 3 houses.

P. Roberts:

Q: How will you get into private road?

A: Side walk to be held at its existing elevation to slow traffic.

K. Gesmundo:

Q: Will the street be gated?

A: No.

Q: Will the private road be called Waco or something else?

A: Not sure. Community would like it to remain Waco or use something historical (Wallace Court?).

S. Bittle-Patton:

Concerned about parking on Waco & Ellison. Current road cannot accommodate more traffic. Buses and construction vehicles cannot make it through when people are parked on the road.

Called out error on technical notes (references 7/10 instead of 4/4) – see plans.

Response: Petitioner acknowledged mistake in technical notes. Will adjust notes.

Q: Can the rezoning be anything other than UR-2 CD?

A: The Petitioner can try to find something softer (least offensive district type?).

S. Pfahl:

Q: Will Lot 4 own Lot 5?

A: Not sure, but not likely. Petitioner plans to hold for long-term. City has requested they be combined.

Q: Will Petitioner combine Lot 4 and Lot 5? Can you commit it to tree save?

A: We plan to save trees, but cannot commit the area reflected at "Lot 5" to tree save.

B. Santanna:

Q: What are the short-term plans for Lot 5?

A: No short-term plans. There may be some utility work (Duke, etc.), but nothing from Petitioner.

Q: What are the side lots?

A: Same as the rest of the neighborhood. 5 feet side yards.

D. McKenzie:

Q: What will happen if Petitioner does not get the rezoning?

A: Either sell the 3 lots or hold for 2 years and try to rezone again.

D. Powell:

Q: If there were only 3 lots, would there be a private road?

A: No. All 3 driveways would be on the public road (Waco/Ellison).

Q: Can builder have 2 car garages instead of 1 car garage?

A: Will need to review and discuss with builder. May be able to have a 1 car garage, but a 2 car pad.

D. Sucherman:

Q: Time frame for rezoning and construction?

A: October vote on rezoning, convey lots likely in Jan. 2019, construction will begin almost immediately. Road will be built before construction begins.

Q: Can a hedgerow be planted next to private road?

A: Yes. Will suggest evergreens (screening/privacy).

Q: What will happen with all the power lines near Lot 5?

A: Likely transformers will come off poles and be placed on a pad (underground utilities), but cannot guarantee. Duke Energy engineering department will manage. Plan improves with utility improvements. Petitioner motivated by the same concerns as the neighborhood.

S. Bittle-Patton:

Q: Concerns about construction parking and access.

A: Offered to hold another meeting bringing in the builder to discuss construction parking concerns.

Q: When will the revised plans be up?

A: Petitioner must have submitted revised plans by August 13, 2018.

Council Member Driggs:

Some of us – all members of the Cherry Neighborhood - have previously opposed the proposed Rezoning Petition 2018-078, most recently speaking against the petition at the City Council Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. Since that time Conformity Corp. (Petitioner) has re-submitted their site plan (revision 3) for the rezoning, and has been in direct contact with some immediate Cherry neighbors.

Mr. Ritchey stated to us and others present at the City Council meeting of September 24th that he would be in touch with the Cherry Neighborhood to further discuss the rezoning plans and the wishes of the Cherry Neighborhood. No outreach has been forthcoming from Mr. Ritchey or Conformity Corp. to the Cherry neighborhood, despite Mr. Ritchey's assurances that this would take place.

We in the neighborhood are both perplexed and alarmed that despite acknowledgement of the legitimacy of our concerns about the proposed plan by planning staff, City Council members, and members of the Zoning Committee, the plan continues to be advanced through the process.

Although density is the stated reason for the rezoning petition, the issue is not density. Parking is an issue, even in Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3. But it is not the only problem with the application.

After reviewing Conformity's Site Plan Revision 3, we continue to oppose the Rezoning Petition, for the following reasons:

1. Public Safety

The proposed 20' wide "Private Drive" or alley proposed by Conformity Corp. does not allow for the entry of City emergency vehicles to the houses along the proposed "private drive" if even one vehicle is parked along this alley. This is both unacceptable and unnecessary. The only reason for the narrowness of the proposed "private drive" is Conformity Corp.'s desire to permit the building of four residences, rather than the three that would be permissible under the current zoning. The existing Storm and Sanitary sewer easements and adjoining homes constrain the ability to put four homes on the parcel without squeezing the street width. We understand the motivation, but do not accept that rezoning is appropriate when the only beneficiary is the Applicant. It would set a terrible precedent – if allowed, every real estate speculator or developer will pursue the same solution.

We have included in this email following photos taken as recently as Tuesday, October 9, showing traffic challenges with current parking at Waco and Ellison Streets, which are both considerably wider than Conformity's proposed 20'.

2. Safety of the eventual homeowners on the "Private Drive"

At the impromptu discussion following the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th, we challenged Mr. Ritchey with the following observation: If you are the owner of a house built on the proposed Lot 1 (at the end of the alley), and you drive your car into your garage or parking apron, how will you get out again? Even assuming that there are no other cars parked on the "private drive", the street must be wide enough for the homeowner to turn around. Even a reverse K-turn requires that the street be wider than the length of the vehicle, unless the vegetation along the alley is to be continually sacrificed.

A typical large SUV or light duty pickup e.g. a full bed Ford F-150 is longer than 20'. (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List of longest consumer road vehicles). That means that the homeowner would have to back over 100' just to get out of his/her garage or, alternatively, back into the driveway of a neighbor's house. If the resident is towing a boat or work trailer, maneuvering is not possible.

This flies in the face of reasonableness, and is a safety hazard. Mr. Ritchey, when challenged with this observation, stated that a vehicle turn-around study would be done. Has this been done and reviewed by City planning staff? We also challenged Mr. Ritchey to come up with a plan that utilized a cul-de- sac to provide turnaround space for both City emergency vehicles and the residents of the new subdivision. He said he would do so. Has City planning staff received this?

3. Insufficient infrastructure

Charlotte Water Department declined to approve the rezoning based on insufficient sanitary sewer capacity to support an additional four houses. To our knowledge, this has not been addressed in Site Plan revision 3. Has City planning staff cleared this obstacle?

4. Appropriateness for the neighborhood.

Petitioner argues for the rezoning by citing the Saussy Burbank homes that have been built in Cherry over the past several years. Those parcels were rezoned to higher density to accommodate more houses. However, those houses front on public streets, not on narrow alleys as the Petitioner proposes. Typically, even in urban densities, the preference is to place dwellings on streets with the front of the dwelling facing the street, NOT an alley. This point was strenuously made by Ed McKinney in explaining the reasons for not approving Revolve Residential's rezoning request in NoDa at the October 24 City Council zoning meeting. There is nothing else like this in Cherry. It would be unfortunate if this rezoning were approved, which would set a precedent for shoehorning new single-family houses into private alleys. There are follow-on issues of private alley maintenance, lighting, planting and more. Are "Private Drives" to be the future direction for Charlotte infill development?

5. No commitment to a Tree Save area between Lot 4 and Scott Baynes' property.

Mr. Ritchey stated, immediately following the September 24th meeting, that a future connection to Welker Avenue was possible. He also stated in the rezoning hearing of September 24th that the easement for the sanitary sewer line in this area had been improperly recorded. Hence utilizing this space for Tree Save was not possible.

Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3 shows "potential tree save area" of 5590 sf. None of that is in the area between Lot 4 and immediate neighbor Scott Bayne's property, where it is most needed. Much of the 5590 sf indicated as "potential tree save area" is already in the SWIM/PCSO buffer area, and hence is double counted. In any case only 2524.30 sf – less than half the amount shown on Conformity's Site Plan Revsion 3 - will actually be used. Logically the 2524.30 sf would be used between Lot 4 as shown and Scott Baynes' property. The SWIM/PCSO buffer already take care of tree save in that buffer.

Petitioner has stated during the rezoning process that it is keeping its options open for either a future fifth lot or a connection to other future lots. We cannot see how an implied fifth lot could be created without building over either a storm or sanitary sewer. This area should preferably have a conservation easement given its proximity to the creek and sewer lines running through it. Has Planning staff reviewed the alleged improper recordation of the sanitary sewer easement?

Conformity's rezoning plan, as shown on Revision 3, is no better, and in some ways worse, than Revision 2, discussed at the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. At this point we have little confidence that what have heard the whole truth from Conformity, since they have told us multiple, conflicting tales.

No one is challenging the merit or desirability of developing the parcel in question. What we do question is the continued lack of specificity and consistency from Conformity, and the fundamental basis for a rezoning of the parcel.

We believe that Conformity can put together a subdivision plan that meets the needs of both the Cherry neighborhood and the long-term goals of the City of Charlotte. However, we do not believe that residents of the City of Charlotte have an obligation to approve a substandard rezoning application solely to enrich Conformity Corp.

We recommend that the Rezoning Application be rejected, and further recommend that Petitioner meet with both interested Cherry residents and appropriate City planning staff, simultaneously, to discuss what alternatives are available.

The proposal (starts on page 3) has been updated to expand from a reproductive healthcare facility buffer zone to a medical facilities safe zone. While some of these protections may exist in current city ordinances, in addition to the new protections the proposal includes, it's vital for all the protections to be included in one place for the purpose of providing specific guidance to CMPD on how to enforce the prohibitions in the context of a medical facility. I hope we can be really specific with the language on

what "blocking, obstructing, or interfering" means and how it is enforced in the context of access to medical care. All patients seeking medical care are in a vulnerable state and should be protected from harassment and manipulation in pursuit of that care. There is a higher degree of care in this context and, therefore, the language needs to reflect that.

The proposal also includes "opt in" language for all facilities. This allows the ordinance to be applied in a practical sense, such that all medical facilities would not come under the protection of the ordinance automatically. If a medical facility does not have a need or purpose for the protection, it can be waived. This will allow for CMPD to enforce the protection only where it is needed, i.e. where harassment and obstruction to medical access is taking place. Further, there is a carve out for permissibility of permits issued to the owner or agent of the facility. So, hopefully that provides enough "wiggle room" as to not result in unintended consequences.

Last, I included several examples of existing protections (starts on page 2). You will see that the SCOTUS decision in 2014 does nothing to render this type of protection unconstitutional. Instead, that decision strengthened the buffer zone that exists in New York (along with keeping others intact).

In the upcoming weeks, we will be meeting with medical facilities around Charlotte to ask for their support of the ordinance. Let me know if you would like to discuss prior to the 14th.

City of Charlotte Healthcare Facility Safe Zone Proposal

WHAT THIS ORDINANCE WILL DO:

This ordinance will prohibit:

- Physically obstructing or blocking a person from entering or exiting a healthcare facility;
- Obstructing or blocking the premises of a healthcare facility in a manner that impedes access;
- Following or harassing a person seeking to enter, entering, or leaving a healthcare facility, or engaging in disorderly conduct or in a course of conduct that places another person in reasonable fear of physical harm outside a healthcare facility;
- Impersonating a law enforcement personnel, a city official, or a healthcare professional outside a healthcare facility;
- Issuing amplified sound permits outside a healthcare facility; and
- Issuing parade permits outside a healthcare facility.

WHAT THIS ORDINANCE WILL NOT DO:

This will NOT stop peaceful protests outside of healthcare facilities. As long as the behavior doesn't cross the line into harassment, physical contact or threatened physical contact, obstruction or blocking people from going in or out of a facility, unlawful impersonation of licensed professions, disorderly conduct, or cause someone to reasonably fear for their safety, it will still be entirely legal. The first amendment guarantees citizens right to free speech and lawful assembly, and this ordinance does nothing to change that. Further, the prohibition of amplified sound permits and parade permits outside of healthcare facilities does not violate citizens' rights to free speech. Instead, it protects patients from amplified harassment and obstruction of access to healthcare.

PRECEDENT:

- In Melbourne, Florida there was a 36 feet fixed buffer zone around a clinic, a 300 feet floating buffer zone around patients, and a 300 feet buffer zone around the homes of the clinic's employees. The injunction also regulated noise levels outside of the clinic and prevented demonstrators from displaying images which could be seen from inside. It was upheld in full by the Supreme Court of Florida but came before the U.S. Supreme Court (SCOTUS) in *Madsen v. Women's Health Center* in 1994. The Court upheld the fixed buffer zone, and the noise regulation around clinics and in residential areas, but rejected the floating buffer zone, residential buffer zone, and prohibition against displaying images. The buffer zone stands today.
- In 1993, Colorado enacted a 100 feet fixed and eight feet floating buffer zone. The Colorado law was examined once before by the high court. In the 2000 case *Hill vs. Colorado*, a 6-3 majority upheld the state's buffer zone and found it constitutionally sound. The buffer zones stand today.
- In Buffalo and Rochester, New York there was both a 15 feet fixed and 15 feet floating buffer zone around four clinics in two cities. The buffer zone resulted from an injunction issued by the U.S. district court in response to a federal lawsuit filed against 50 individuals and three pro-life organizations. The law was challenged in the 1997 case court case, *Schenck v. Pro-Choice Network of Western New York*. The case came before SCOTUS, where the Court, in considering *Madsen v. Women's Health Center*, ruled 8-1

to uphold the constitutionality of the fixed buffer zone, but not that of a floating buffer zone. The buffer zone stands today.

- In 2005, Montana enacted a 36 feet fixed buffer zone and an eight feet floating buffer zone. The state law forbids someone from knowingly approaching within eight feet of a person entering or leaving a health care facility to give the person written or oral information, to display a sign, or to protest, counsel or educate about a health care issue, when the person does not consent to that activity and is within 36 feet of an entrance or exit from the health care facility. A person convicted of this crime can be fined up to \$100. The buffer zones stand today.
- In West Palm Beach, Florida, a state law prohibits amplified sound at all healthcare facilities. U.S. District Judge Donald Middlebrooks upheld the regulation against excessive noise and the federal Appeals Court upheld his ruling in 2014 saying "The Sound Ordinance targets only actions ... that produce types of noise that can endanger patients." The sound ordinance stands today.
- In Chicago, Illinois, there is an 8 foot floating buffer zone within 50 feet of clinic entrance enacted in November 2009. The ordinance is designed after the Colorado law that creates an 8-foot no-approach zone within a 100-foot radius of all health care facilities and that was upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court in *Hill vs. Colorado* in 2000. The buffer zone stands today.
- In 2014, SCOTUS ruled in *McCullen V. Coakley* that Massachusetts state law which set a 30-foot buffer zone blocking any protest activity within 30 feet of an abortion clinic was an unconstitutional restriction of the first amendment right to free speech. In the SCOTUS ruling, the Court also concluded that the state or locality did have an interest in protecting people entering and exiting a reproductive health care facility and explicitly stated that "If the Commonwealth [of Massachusetts] is particularly concerned about harassment, it could also consider an ordinance such as the one adopted in New York City that not only prohibits obstructing access to a clinic, but also makes it a crime "to follow and harass another person within 15 feet of the premises of a reproductive health care facility." The ruling also did not overturn the Colorado law.
- In 2005, the city of Pittsburgh passed an ordinance that created a 15-foot fixed buffer zone and an 8 foot floating zone around abortion clinics. However, a court ruled in 2009 while either option would be constitutional on its own, the city could not enforce both zones simultaneously. Pittsburgh elected to keep the fixed zone in place. After the *McCullen v. Coakley* decision, protestors in Pittsburgh filed a new challenge against the buffer zone ordinance, but in March 2015, a federal judge upheld the zone, holding that the ruling in *McCullen* did not impact the constitutionality of Pittsburgh's law. The buffer zone stands today.
- In January of 2015, the Spokane City Council passed an ordinance that outlawed interfering with vehicular traffic in private driveways. This ordinance covers all driveways, but it was a response to anti-choice protester activity that blocked Planned Parenthood of Greater Washington and North Idaho's driveway. The ordinance stands today.
- In June 2016, the Columbus, OH City Council unanimously passed the Healthcare Workers and Patient Protection Ordinance. The measure establishes a 15-foot zone around clinics, within which there are enhanced penalties for engaging in "disorderly conduct." This ordinance also prohibits obstruction of clinic entrances and premises, and prohibits conduct within the buffer zone that "places another person in reasonable fear of physical harm, or attempts to do the same." The ordinance stands today.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE:

It shall be unlawful for any person to physically obstruct or block a person from entering or exiting a healthcare facility by physically striking, shoving, restraining, grabbing, or otherwise subjecting the person to unwanted physical contact or attempting or threatening to do the same.

It shall be unlawful for any person to obstruct or block the premises of a healthcare facility in a manner that impedes access to or from a healthcare facility, to block the driveway of a healthcare facility, or to engage in behavior that disrupts, blocks, obstructs, or interferes with pedestrian or vehicular traffic or the free passage of pedestrian or vehicular traffic into any driveway of a healthcare facility. Obstructing or blocking access to the premise of a healthcare facility or the driveway of a healthcare facility includes, but is not limited to, stopping or attempting to stop any vehicle for the purpose of soliciting or accepting contributions from the occupants of any vehicle or for the purpose of distributing merchandise or services to the occupants of any vehicle.

It shall be unlawful for any person to follow or harass a patient seeking to enter, entering, or leaving a healthcare facility within 100 feet of said healthcare facility. It is unlawful to engage in disorderly conduct within 100 feet of a healthcare facility. It is unlawful to engage in a course of conduct or repeatedly commit acts within 100 feet of the premises of a healthcare facility when that behavior places another person in reasonable fear of physical harm or attempting to do the same.

It shall be unlawful for any person to impersonate law enforcement personnel, a city official, or a healthcare professional within 100 feet of a healthcare facility. Impersonation of a law enforcement personnel or a city official includes, but is not limited to, engaging in conduct meant to confuse patients seeking medical treatment regarding street closures or providing false information in an attempt to direct a person seeking medical attention away from a healthcare facility. Impersonating a healthcare professional includes, but is not limited to, providing unsolicited medical advice in an unlicensed capacity.

It shall be unlawful for a parade permit to be issued for a location that is within 100 feet of a healthcare facility or for a route that includes a city street within 100 feet of a healthcare facility, unless issued to the owner or other authorized agent of the facility.

It shall be unlawful for an amplified sound permit to be issued for a location that is within 100 feet of a healthcare facility, unless issued to the owner or other authorized agent of the facility.

"Healthcare facility" as used in this section includes, but is not limited to, hospitals, physicians' offices, walk-in healthcare centers, healthcare diagnostic centers, surgical centers, and facilities which are licensed, certified or otherwise authorized to perform healthcare procedures in this state and to provide health services. "Healthcare facility" shall not include mobile healthcare facilities, residential homes, convalescent homes or other facilities that provide long-term residency.

It shall be the duty of the healthcare facility that wishes to be included under the scope of this ordinance to provide to City Council a letter certifying that they are in fact a healthcare facility as designated herein, the address of the facility, and the owner and any authorized agent(s) as applicable. City Council shall maintain these letters and check permit requests against addresses and facilities provided.

Hi Larken:

Thanks for sharing. Please see my responses below. I may defer and I thank you for your support with that. I will reach out to you tomorrow regarding a possible deferral. Responses are below in red.

Council Member Egleston:

Some of us – all members of the Cherry Neighborhood - have previously opposed the proposed Rezoning Petition 2018-078, most recently speaking against the petition at the City Council Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. Since that time Conformity Corp. (Petitioner) has resubmitted their site plan (revision 3) for the rezoning, and has been in direct contact with some immediate Cherry neighbors.

Mr. Ritchey stated to us and others present at the City Council meeting of September 24th that he would be in touch with the Cherry Neighborhood to further discuss the rezoning plans and the wishes of the Cherry Neighborhood. No outreach has been forthcoming from Mr. Ritchey or Conformity Corp. to the Cherry neighborhood, despite Mr. Ritchey's assurances that this would take place.

It's true that I have not been able to meet again with Homeowners in Cherry. I have been travelling extensively doing the work related to the Brooklyn Village Project in uptown Charlotte and ventures on Dafuskie Island and elsewhere. I should also say that the tone issuing forth from homeowners is frankly off putting. When last we were together in the lobby of the Government Building, individuals threatened lawsuits and other disproportionately aggressive actions. Who wants to participate in that? A quick look at our body of work and relationships cements the notion that we are not in the habit of misleading anyone. Despite that claim, here we are.

We in the neighborhood are both perplexed and alarmed that despite acknowledgement of the legitimacy of our concerns about the proposed plan by planning staff, City Council members, and members of the Zoning Committee, the plan continues to be advanced through the process.

Although density is the stated reason for the rezoning petition, the issue is not density.

True in some respects, I suppose. R-6 multiplied by our acreage reveals 4 homes allowed by right as a density matter, but as you know, we do not have the required front feet (40')

Parking is an issue, even in Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3.

That seems an impossibility to me, having provided 4 parking spaces for each home. There are two in each garage and two on a parking pad.

But it is not the only problem with the application.

After reviewing Conformity's Site Plan Revision 3, we continue to oppose the Rezoning Petition, for the following reasons:

1. Public Safety

The proposed 20' wide "Private Drive" or alley proposed by Conformity Corp. does not allow for the entry of City emergency vehicles to the houses along the proposed "private drive" if even one vehicle is parked along this alley. This is both unacceptable and unnecessary.

The Fire Department, is satisfied with the safety of the development. Fire trucks do not need to enter the "Private Street" to address any fire that may occur along it. Fire can also be serviced from the parking lot of King's Court immediately adjacent to the site. The Fire Department keeps detailed notes related to such much matters, by address, in its response system. Conformity Corp has decades of experience insuring life safety standards are met in scenarios that are much much more complex than this one. There simply is no fire serviceability risk as a part of this petition. Homeowners saying otherwise does not make it so.

The only reason for the narrowness of the proposed "private drive" is Conformity Corp.'s desire to permit the building of four residences, rather than the three that would be permissible under the current zoning. The existing Storm and Sanitary sewer easements and adjoining homes constrain the ability to put four homes on the parcel without squeezing the street width.

"squeezing the street width" is misleading. The street we've proposed existing today in the Charlotte Mecklenburg Land Development Standards Manual and has been successfully used to improve the community hundreds and hundreds of times across Mecklenburg County.

We understand the motivation, but do not accept that rezoning is appropriate when the only beneficiary is the Applicant.

The Petition is also of benefit to the citizenry of Mecklenburg County and the County and City. Conformity has for years dedicated itself to award winning infill in urban contexts. Conformity developments make the best use of municipally incorporated land by thoughtfully delivering improved tax base on what are otherwise unruly and pieces of land. Using land wisely drives down costs of all types for the municipality and in turn drives town taxes for the citizenry.

It would set a terrible precedent – if allowed, every real estate speculator or developer will pursue the same solution.

I believe you know that this is simply not true given that each rezoning undertaken is considered uniquely by Council.

We have included in this email following photos taken as recently as Tuesday, October 9, showing traffic challenges with current parking at Waco and Ellison Streets, which are both considerably wider than Conformity's proposed 20'.

Conformity has not seen these photos. Fortunately, the development proposed pursuant to this petition 2017-78 does not add to the on street parking load.

2. Safety of the eventual homeowners on the "Private Drive"

At the impromptu discussion following the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th, we challenged Mr. Ritchey with the following observation: If you are the owner of a house built on the proposed Lot 1 (at the end of the alley), and you drive your car into your garage or parking apron, how will you get out again? Even assuming that there are no other cars parked on the "private drive", the street must be wide enough for the homeowner to turn around. Even a reverse K-turn requires that the street be

wider than the length of the vehicle, unless the vegetation along the alley is to be continually sacrificed.

A typical large SUV or light duty pickup e.g. a full bed Ford F-150 is longer than 20'.

(https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List of longest consumer road vehicles). That means that the homeowner would have to back over 100' just to get out of his/her garage or, alternatively, back into the driveway of a neighbor's house. If the resident is towing a boat or work trailer, maneuvering is not possible.

This flies in the face of reasonableness, and is a safety hazard. Mr. Ritchey, when challenged with this observation, stated that a vehicle turn-around study would be done. Has this been done and reviewed by City planning staff? We also challenged Mr. Ritchey to come up with a plan that utilized a cul-de- sac to provide turnaround space for both City emergency vehicles and the residents of the new subdivision. He said he would do so. Has City planning staff received this?

We can provide a Auto-turn diagrams if needed, Larken. You may know that the drive aisle in most shopping centers is 22', a dimension that is more than ample. Our road, which is continually called out as being 20' wide, is actually 22' feet due to its' flat banded curbs.

3. Insufficient infrastructure

Charlotte Water Department declined to approve the rezoning based on insufficient sanitary sewer capacity to support an additional four houses. To our knowledge, this has not been addressed in Site Plan revision 3. Has City planning staff cleared this obstacle?

The approval of a rezoning petition has nothing to do with the myriad approvals associated with securing building permits. Charlotte Water will review these issues during permitting and an approved rezoning petition and related density does not impact Charlotte Water's decision making. Historically, City Council has not considered this particular issue as part of its decision making. While Charlotte Water has said it, ".....does not concur with the rezoning based upon the limited project information available", that is not the same as being opposed. Rather, Charlotte Water says, "It is recommended that the applicant contact the Charlotte Water New Services at (704) 432-2854 for further information and to discuss options regarding sanitary sewer system capacity." We will do this during permitting.

4. Appropriateness for the neighborhood.

Petitioner argues for the rezoning by citing the Saussy Burbank homes that have been built in Cherry over the past several years. Those parcels were rezoned to higher density to accommodate more houses.

Actually, we downzoned that property. It had been rezoned to UR-2 (CD) by the prior owner who failed to develop the property. The prior owner has presented townhomes as part of its UR-2 conditional plan (and was approved). Upon purchasing the property, a Conformity affiliate changed the conditional plan to provide for single family.

However, those houses front on public streets, not on narrow alleys as the Petitioner proposes.

The proposed 4 homes do not front on a narrow alley. The homes front a 22' wide "Private Street". The details of this City Engineering dictated street section are located in the Charlotte Mecklenburg Land Development Standards Manual at detail 11.13.

Typically, even in urban densities, the preference is to place dwellings on streets with the front of the dwelling facing the street, NOT an alley.

The homes anticipated by the Conformity Corp petition 2018-78 face a "Private Street", not an alley.

This point was strenuously made by Ed McKinney in explaining the reasons for not approving Revolve Residential's rezoning request in NoDa at the October 24 City Council zoning meeting.

The Revolve Residential plan does not prescribe an approved street detail in the submittal. The Conformity Corp petition 2018-78 does; detail 11.13 of the Charlotte Mecklenburg Land Development Standards Manual.

There is nothing else like this in Cherry. It would be unfortunate if this rezoning were approved, which would set a precedent for shoehorning new single-family houses into private alleys.

The homes presented in petition number 2018-78 do not front on a private alley. They front on a drive dimensioned as a "Private Street" at detail 11.13 of the Charlotte Mecklenburg Land Development Standards Manual. The homes will not be shoehorned.

There are follow-on issues of private alley maintenance, lighting, planting and more.

The "Private Street" will be maintained jointly by way of a simply maintenance agreement to which each homeowner will be a party. Likewise will be the bushes down the right hand side as well as the sidewalk and curb. The water meters for will be in the Ellison and/or Waco ROW (not private) and the sewer taps will meet with requirements for dedication for public maintenance.

Are "Private Drives" to be the future direction for Charlotte infill development?

5. No commitment to a Tree Save area between Lot 4 and Scott Baynes' property.

Mr. Ritchey stated, immediately following the September 24th meeting, that a future connection to Welker Avenue was possible.

The possibility of future connection mentioned was to the rear lots of Henley Road homes. You may see these back lots in the attached 1908 Plat from the JS Myers Company. These lots already exist. We never suggested connecting to Welker. Connecting to Henley back lots is a longshot, but will we will retain ownership of the land that connects to those lots.

He also stated in the rezoning hearing of September 24th that the easement for the sanitary sewer line in this area had been improperly recorded. Hence utilizing this space for Tree Save was not possible.

There is a *properly recorded Stormwater Easement* between Lot 4 and Scott Baynes' property. A sanitary sewer line runs through the same area and there is no properly recorded easement, but the missing easement is mute as the line lies within the properly recorded Stormwater Easement first mentioned. It is the Urban Forestry Department who will not allow the Petitioner to take credit for tree save in areas that contain recorded easements. If neighbors would like to negotiate to save

trees in that area, we've not heard that. The only feedback we've received so far, and from Mr. Bayne, is "If you cut down trees in that area, I'll sue you."

Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3 shows "potential tree save area" of 5590 sf. None of that is in the area between Lot 4 and immediate neighbor Scott Bayne's property, where it is most needed. Much of the 5590 sf indicated as "potential tree save area" is already in the SWIM/PCSO buffer area, and hence is double counted. In any case only 2524.30 sf – less than half the amount shown on Conformity's Site Plan Revsion 3 - will actually be used. Logically the 2524.30 sf would be used between Lot 4 as shown and Scott Baynes' property. The SWIM/PCSO buffer already take care of tree save in that buffer.

The Petitioner presented the tree save the way the reviewing departments asked us to show it. The reviewing departments mandated that we not show potential ordinance-required tree save areas in the easement tracts. The Petitioner instead gathered up potential tree save from nearly every other available area.

Petitioner has stated during the rezoning process that it is keeping its options open for either a future fifth lot or a connection to other future lots. We cannot see how an implied fifth lot could be created without building over either a storm or sanitary sewer. This area should preferably have a conservation easement given its proximity to the creek and sewer lines running through it. Has Planning staff reviewed the alleged improper recordation of the sanitary sewer easement?

There is a properly recorded Stormwater Easement and the Sanitary Sewer line lies within it. The Petitioner will not consider a conservation easement. A recorded easement exists.

Conformity's rezoning plan, as shown on Revision 3, is no better, and in some ways worse, than Revision 2, discussed at the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. At this point we have little confidence that what have heard the whole truth from Conformity, since they have told us multiple, conflicting tales.

How is it worse? We've improved the parking immensely. I am disappointed in myself that homeowner's feel misled. A review of all submittals and emails reveals an absolutely consistent and evolving plan. 4 homes on a "Private Street".

No one is challenging the merit or desirability of developing the parcel in question. What we do question is the continued lack of specificity and consistency from Conformity, and the fundamental basis for a rezoning of the parcel.

The plan submitted is "conditiona" land includes a tremendous amount of detail, down to a mail box location (something requested by Homeowners). "Conservations easements" and the like requested by homeowners do not translate to a lack of consistency on the Petitoner's part.

We believe that Conformity can put together a subdivision plan that meets the needs of both the Cherry neighborhood and the long-term goals of the City of Charlotte. However, we do not believe that residents of the City of Charlotte have an obligation to approve a substandard rezoning application solely to enrich Conformity Corp.

The Petitioner's submittal is absolutely consistent with every City Plan and ordinance that affects it. The Petitioner has advanced the Plan through 3 submittals; each in response to the comments from Staff and Neighbors to arrive where we are today:

- · No outstanding issues with Staff
- Unanimous consent from Zoning Committee

These two points are not mentioned here by the author.

We recommend that the Rezoning Application be rejected, and further recommend that Petitioner meet with both interested Cherry residents and appropriate City planning staff, simultaneously, to discuss what alternatives are available.

Naturally, we do not want to see the application defeated. I will proceed as you direct, Larken.

Thank you for meeting with Tish and me last Thursday. After learning more during our meeting, we shared what we learned with many concerned Cherry community members. Many of our neighbors see this as an environmental justice issue for Cherry, and voiced concern that this would never have happened in communities where the people responsible for putting PP in OUR neighborhood live (such as SouthPark or Myers Park). We met and spoke with Officer Kornberg and clinic workers at Latrobe on Saturday morning, and have consulted with other parties on this matter. Please see our response from Cherry neighbors below.

We believe Planned Parenthood should be located ENTIRELY in a business or industrial area where the nuisance created by daily protests does not harm residents. This is not a "prochoice" or "prolife" issue for us. It is a quality of life issue. We do not agree with the decision to locate Planned Parenthood in our historic residential community. Cherry, of all communities, does not deserve this.

We have several concerns:

- (a) That the business did not reach out to the very residents of the neighborhood that will be materially affected by their presence in the neighborhood.
- (b) That the business intentionally hid their plans to move into Cherry from the public (including Cherry residents) for over two years. Many residents still do not know the public nuisance they will soon face. Many are already experiencing a daily nuisance and don't understand what is happening because they were not informed or given a chance to respond.
- (c) That the City did not adequately plan for the imminent maelstrom the residents will face, and in fact participated with the business in "keeping quiet" the information about the business moving in, due to fear of political response by the same demonstrators that have now been unleashed on our community. No measures were taken by Planning to ensure a safe residential neighborhood, such as making street parking in Cherry "resident-only". No public meetings for the neighbors were facilitated

by City Council members or the Mayor, even those working closely with the business who attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony.

Anyone familiar with this issue -- presumably including all City Council members and the Mayor-who has been to the Latrobe or Hebron St. women's clinics knows that there are hundreds and periodically thousands of activists that gather at the clinic locations on a daily basis. They require HUNDREDS of parking spaces, staging areas, police presence, barricades, permits, sound equipment, signage, and a place for their giant RV. We cannot play naïve and wonder if this will happen at THIS women's clinic. And yet, the City has no plan to relieve or prevent this daily occupation of our neighborhood. Planned Parenthood has offered the community no plan that acknowledges the protesters that come along with their business. "Let's wait and see" is an insult to the hardworking families of Cherry. We deserve transparency, honesty, and a proposal that prioritizes the needs of the RESIDENTS of our community. Cherry neighborhood is the closest parking to the clinic and there are currently no restrictions whatsoever. The protesters this business brings would consume most of the parking in the neighborhood. This is unacceptable.

We now have the additional concern that the location was chosen with the sole expressed plan for protest response being that *residents would be responsible for calling police* whenever a nuisance occurred, forcing residents to take on a time-consuming and potentially unsafe role in a situation they had no part in creating. Cwm. Eiselt stated that a residential neighborhood (Cherry) was preferable to an industrial/business area because the political opponents to Planned Parenthood (who are merely exercising their First Amendment rights) wouldn't be given "the same grace" by people who were *living* in the neighborhood rather than merely *working* there. This position explicitly relies on residents to respond to the inevitable presence of political activists by using their valuable time in their own community to call the police or take other measures. This is NOT OUR responsibility. We are not here to be anyone's political foot-soldiers. We are already shouldered with a disproportionate burden of intra-community work due to being a historically Black community in the midst of gentrification and integrating new public housing. We have enough on our plate.

We are not here to fight the battle of "prochoice" vs prolife." Some of our residents agree with the protesters' viewpoint. This is an emotional issue and the City and Planned Parenthood have taken no time to think how it might affect or even traumatize some residents. Some of our residents are supporters of the work that Planned Parenthood does. NONE of us want this business in our home space.

Newcomers did not move to Cherry to have a public nuisance be dropped in our peaceful neighborhood. Long time Cherry residents have had to deal with the changes brought on by gentrification and new affordable housing in their neighborhood, and hordes of people staging an ideological battle would be yet another burden.

Prolife groups have a protected right to protest and we have no interest in challenging their legal rights. We DO have an interest in living in a safe, quiet neighborhood without daily protests due to a political lightning rod being foisted upon us. We are peaceful neighbors from different backgrounds and political leanings who want to live in peace with our neighbors and quiet businesses.

Planned Parenthood went to great lengths to hide their identity when purchasing the building and upfitting it to its current intended use. We did not hear from Ms. DinWiddie, Ms. Bowles, or Ms. Hudson as they quietly pursued this "under the radar" business endeavor that will now affect our families' quality of life. We did not hear from elected city officials who proudly attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the business that is already attracting a major nuisance to our quiet community of families.

Cherry is a socially fragile neighborhood that has the potential to be a national example of mixed-income, racially-integrated neighbors. We need support, social resources and transparency from our City leaders and business neighbors. Instead, as a result of Planned Parenthood and the City of Charlotte's actions, we are experiencing an assault on our quality of life, the enjoyment of our properties, and our historic neighborhood.

Our peaceful community is already being disrupted. Neighbors are upset and confused. We deserve better from our City. Planned Parenthood is not a good neighbor.

Community Safety

- 1. Render a final decision about the noise ordinance applicable to businesses located within residential areas. City Council and City staff
- Ascertain how the organization has managed security, protesters, and noise abatement in Asheville, and applicability for Charlotte. Major Kornberg and organization's security staff
- 3. Clarify *in writing* the current ordinances that address what is and is not permissible relative to parking, distances that must be maintained from homes and businesses, sidewalk and street obstruction, picketing and protesting activities, etc. in residential areas of Charlotte.
- 4. Share or direct us to relevant ordinances governing parades and protesting.

Follow-up meeting

In advance of a meeting with the neighborhood, we would like to schedule a final planning meeting with representatives from the organization (security and program staff), Major Kornberg, and representative(s) from City Council. The purpose of the meeting is to share answers to questions raised in our last meeting including the four items listed above, to review talking points for the neighborhood meeting, and to decide on handouts and the language for the meeting announcement.

Timeline

Based on our conversation with Marcie Shealy, here is the estimated timeline.

Early April - Follow-up meeting to answer outstanding questions, finalize plans for neighborhood meeting

May - Construction will be complete

Week of May 13 (Monday, Tuesday, or Thursday)- Meeting with Cherry Neighborhood. We will take care of meeting logistics and communication. The meeting will be led by the organization and CMPD.

May 29 - Signage posted on exterior of building. (We are requesting no signage before this date.)

June 4 - Opening

July - Service delivery begins

We know that you share our sense of urgency as time is passing and word is spreading. Please let us hear from you soon so that we can get the follow-up meeting on the calendar at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church.

Council Member Eiselt:

Some of us – all members of the Cherry Neighborhood - have previously opposed the proposed Rezoning Petition 2018-078, most recently speaking against the petition at the City Council Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. Since that time Conformity Corp. (Petitioner) has re-submitted their site plan (revision 3) for the rezoning, and has been in direct contact with some immediate Cherry neighbors.

Mr. Ritchey stated to us and others present at the City Council meeting of September 24th that he would be in touch with the Cherry Neighborhood to further discuss the rezoning plans and the wishes of the Cherry Neighborhood. No outreach has been forthcoming from Mr. Ritchey or Conformity Corp. to the Cherry neighborhood, despite Mr. Ritchey's assurances that this would take place.

We in the neighborhood are both perplexed and alarmed that despite acknowledgement of the legitimacy of our concerns about the proposed plan by planning staff, City Council members, and members of the Zoning Committee, the plan continues to be advanced through the process.

Although density is the stated reason for the rezoning petition, the issue is not density.

Parking is an issue, even in Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3. But it is not the only problem with the application.

After reviewing Conformity's Site Plan Revision 3, we continue to oppose the Rezoning Petition, for the following reasons:

1. Public Safety

The proposed 20' wide "Private Drive" or alley proposed by Conformity Corp. does not allow for the entry of City emergency vehicles to the houses along the proposed "private drive" if even one vehicle is parked along this alley. This is both unacceptable and unnecessary. The only reason for the narrowness of the proposed "private drive" is Conformity Corp.'s desire to permit the building of four residences, rather than the three that would be permissible under the current zoning. The existing Storm and Sanitary sewer easements and adjoining homes constrain the ability to put four homes on the parcel without squeezing the street width. We understand the motivation, but do not accept that

rezoning is appropriate when the only beneficiary is the Applicant. It would set a terrible precedent – if allowed, every real estate speculator or developer will pursue the same solution.

We have included in this email following photos taken as recently as Tuesday, October 9, showing traffic challenges with current parking at Waco and Ellison Streets, which are both considerably wider than Conformity's proposed 20'.

2. Safety of the eventual homeowners on the "Private Drive"

At the impromptu discussion following the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th, we challenged Mr. Ritchey with the following observation: If you are the owner of a house built on the proposed Lot 1 (at the end of the alley), and you drive your car into your garage or parking apron, how will you get out again? Even assuming that there are no other cars parked on the "private drive", the street must be wide enough for the homeowner to turn around. Even a reverse K-turn requires that the street be wider than the length of the vehicle, unless the vegetation along the alley is to be continually sacrificed.

A typical large SUV or light duty pickup e.g. a full bed Ford F-150 is longer than 20'. (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List of longest consumer road vehicles). That means that the homeowner would have to back over 100' just to get out of his/her garage or, alternatively, back into the driveway of a neighbor's house. If the resident is towing a boat or work trailer, maneuvering is not possible.

This flies in the face of reasonableness, and is a safety hazard. Mr. Ritchey, when challenged with this observation, stated that a vehicle turn-around study would be done. Has this been done and reviewed by City planning staff? We also challenged Mr. Ritchey to come up with a plan that utilized a cul-de- sac to provide turnaround space for both City emergency vehicles and the residents of the new subdivision. He said he would do so. Has City planning staff received this?

3. Insufficient infrastructure

Charlotte Water Department declined to approve the rezoning based on insufficient sanitary sewer capacity to support an additional four houses. To our knowledge, this has not been addressed in Site Plan revision 3. Has City planning staff cleared this obstacle?

4. Appropriateness for the neighborhood.

Petitioner argues for the rezoning by citing the Saussy Burbank homes that have been built in Cherry over the past several years. Those parcels were rezoned to higher density to accommodate more houses. However, those houses front on public streets, not on narrow alleys as the Petitioner proposes. Typically, even in urban densities, the preference is to place dwellings on streets with the front of the dwelling facing the street, NOT an alley. This point was strenuously made by Ed McKinney in explaining the reasons for not approving Revolve Residential's rezoning request in NoDa at the October 24 City Council zoning meeting. There is nothing else like this in Cherry. It would be unfortunate if this rezoning were approved, which would set a precedent for shoehorning new single-family houses into private alleys. There are follow-on issues of private alley maintenance, lighting, planting and more. Are "Private Drives" to be the future direction for Charlotte infill development?

5. No commitment to a Tree Save area between Lot 4 and Scott Baynes' property.

Mr. Ritchey stated, immediately following the September 24th meeting, that a future connection to Welker Avenue was possible. He also stated in the rezoning hearing of September 24th that the easement for the sanitary sewer line in this area had been improperly recorded. Hence utilizing this space for Tree Save was not possible.

Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3 shows "potential tree save area" of 5590 sf. None of that is in the area between Lot 4 and immediate neighbor Scott Bayne's property, where it is most needed. Much of the 5590 sf indicated as "potential tree save area" is already in the SWIM/PCSO buffer area, and hence is double counted. In any case only 2524.30 sf – less than half the amount shown on Conformity's Site Plan Revsion 3 - will actually be used. Logically the 2524.30 sf would be used between Lot 4 as shown and Scott Baynes' property. The SWIM/PCSO buffer already take care of tree save in that buffer.

Petitioner has stated during the rezoning process that it is keeping its options open for either a future fifth lot or a connection to other future lots. We cannot see how an implied fifth lot could be created without building over either a storm or sanitary sewer. This area should preferably have a conservation easement given its proximity to the creek and sewer lines running through it. Has Planning staff reviewed the alleged improper recordation of the sanitary sewer easement?

Conformity's rezoning plan, as shown on Revision 3, is no better, and in some ways worse, than Revision 2, discussed at the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. At this point we have little confidence that what have heard the whole truth from Conformity, since they have told us multiple, conflicting tales.

No one is challenging the merit or desirability of developing the parcel in question. What we do question is the continued lack of specificity and consistency from Conformity, and the fundamental basis for a rezoning of the parcel.

We believe that Conformity can put together a subdivision plan that meets the needs of both the Cherry neighborhood and the long-term goals of the City of Charlotte. However, we do not believe that residents of the City of Charlotte have an obligation to approve a substandard rezoning application solely to enrich Conformity Corp.

We recommend that the Rezoning Application be rejected, and further recommend that Petitioner meet with both interested Cherry residents and appropriate City planning staff, simultaneously, to discuss what alternatives are available.

All patients seeking medical care are in a vulnerable state and should be protected from harassment and manipulation in pursuit of that care. There is a higher degree of care in this context and, therefore, the language needs to reflect that.

The proposal also includes "opt in" language for all facilities. This allows the ordinance to be applied in a practical sense, such that all medical facilities would not come under the protection of the ordinance automatically. If a medical facility does not have a need or purpose for the protection, it can be waived. This will allow for CMPD to enforce the protection only where it is needed, i.e. where harassment and obstruction to medical access is taking place. Further, there is a carve out for permissibility of permits issued to the owner or agent of the facility. So, hopefully that provides enough "wiggle room" as to not result in unintended consequences.

Last, I included several examples of existing protections (starts on page 2). You will see that the SCOTUS decision in 2014 does nothing to render this type of protection unconstitutional. Instead, that decision strengthened the buffer zone that exists in New York (along with keeping others intact).

WHAT THIS ORDINANCE WILL DO:

This ordinance will prohibit:

- Physically obstructing or blocking a person from entering or exiting a healthcare facility;
- Obstructing or blocking the premises of a healthcare facility in a manner that impedes access;
- Following or harassing a person seeking to enter, entering, or leaving a healthcare facility, or engaging in disorderly conduct or in a course of conduct that places another person in reasonable fear of physical harm outside a healthcare facility;
- Impersonating a law enforcement personnel, a city official, or a healthcare professional outside a healthcare facility;
- Issuing amplified sound permits outside a healthcare facility; and
- Issuing parade permits outside a healthcare facility.

WHAT THIS ORDINANCE WILL NOT DO:

This will NOT stop peaceful protests outside of healthcare facilities. As long as the behavior doesn't cross the line into harassment, physical contact or threatened physical contact, obstruction or blocking people from going in or out of a facility, unlawful impersonation of licensed professions, disorderly conduct, or cause someone to reasonably fear for their safety, it will still be entirely legal. The first amendment guarantees citizens right to free speech and lawful assembly, and this ordinance does nothing to change that. Further, the prohibition of amplified sound permits and parade permits outside of healthcare facilities does not violate citizens' rights to free speech. Instead, it protects patients from amplified harassment and obstruction of access to healthcare.

PRECEDENT:

- In Melbourne, Florida there was a 36 feet fixed buffer zone around a clinic, a 300 feet floating buffer zone around patients, and a 300 feet buffer zone around the homes of the clinic's employees. The injunction also regulated noise levels outside of the clinic and prevented demonstrators from displaying images which could be seen from inside. It was upheld in full by the Supreme Court of Florida but came before the U.S. Supreme Court (SCOTUS) in *Madsen v. Women's Health Center* in 1994. The Court upheld the fixed buffer zone, and the noise regulation around clinics and in residential areas, but rejected the floating buffer zone, residential buffer zone, and prohibition against displaying images. The buffer zone stands today.
- In 1993, Colorado enacted a 100 feet fixed and eight feet floating buffer zone. The Colorado law was examined once before by the high court. In the 2000 case *Hill vs. Colorado*, a 6-3 majority upheld the state's buffer zone and found it constitutionally sound. The buffer zones stand today.
- In Buffalo and Rochester, New York there was both a 15 feet fixed and 15 feet floating buffer zone around four clinics in two cities. The buffer zone resulted from an injunction issued by the U.S. district court in response to a federal lawsuit filed against 50 individuals and three pro-life organizations. The law was challenged in the 1997 case court case, *Schenck v. Pro-Choice Network of Western New York*. The case came before SCOTUS, where the Court, in considering *Madsen v. Women's Health Center*, ruled 8-1

to uphold the constitutionality of the fixed buffer zone, but not that of a floating buffer zone. The buffer zone stands today.

- In 2005, Montana enacted a 36 feet fixed buffer zone and an eight feet floating buffer zone. The state law forbids someone from knowingly approaching within eight feet of a person entering or leaving a health care facility to give the person written or oral information, to display a sign, or to protest, counsel or educate about a health care issue, when the person does not consent to that activity and is within 36 feet of an entrance or exit from the health care facility. A person convicted of this crime can be fined up to \$100. The buffer zones stand today.
- In West Palm Beach, Florida, a state law prohibits amplified sound at all healthcare facilities. U.S. District Judge Donald Middlebrooks upheld the regulation against excessive noise and the federal Appeals Court upheld his ruling in 2014 saying "The Sound Ordinance targets only actions ... that produce types of noise that can endanger patients." The sound ordinance stands today.
- In Chicago, Illinois, there is an 8 foot floating buffer zone within 50 feet of clinic entrance enacted in November 2009. The ordinance is designed after the Colorado law that creates an 8-foot no-approach zone within a 100-foot radius of all health care facilities and that was upheld by the U.S. Supreme Court in *Hill vs. Colorado* in 2000. The buffer zone stands today.
- In 2014, SCOTUS ruled in *McCullen V. Coakley* that Massachusetts state law which set a 30-foot buffer zone blocking any protest activity within 30 feet of an abortion clinic was an unconstitutional restriction of the first amendment right to free speech. In the SCOTUS ruling, the Court also concluded that the state or locality did have an interest in protecting people entering and exiting a reproductive health care facility and explicitly stated that "If the Commonwealth [of Massachusetts] is particularly concerned about harassment, it could also consider an ordinance such as the one adopted in New York City that not only prohibits obstructing access to a clinic, but also makes it a crime "to follow and harass another person within 15 feet of the premises of a reproductive health care facility." The ruling also did not overturn the Colorado law.
- In 2005, the city of Pittsburgh passed an ordinance that created a 15-foot fixed buffer zone and an 8 foot floating zone around abortion clinics. However, a court ruled in 2009 while either option would be constitutional on its own, the city could not enforce both zones simultaneously. Pittsburgh elected to keep the fixed zone in place. After the *McCullen v. Coakley* decision, protestors in Pittsburgh filed a new challenge against the buffer zone ordinance, but in March 2015, a federal judge upheld the zone, holding that the ruling in *McCullen* did not impact the constitutionality of Pittsburgh's law. The buffer zone stands today.
- In January of 2015, the Spokane City Council passed an ordinance that outlawed interfering with vehicular traffic in private driveways. This ordinance covers all driveways, but it was a response to anti-choice protester activity that blocked Planned Parenthood of Greater Washington and North Idaho's driveway. The ordinance stands today.
- In June 2016, the Columbus, OH City Council unanimously passed the Healthcare Workers and Patient Protection Ordinance. The measure establishes a 15-foot zone around clinics, within which there are enhanced penalties for engaging in "disorderly conduct." This ordinance also prohibits obstruction of clinic entrances and premises, and prohibits conduct within the buffer zone that "places another person in reasonable fear of physical harm, or attempts to do the same." The ordinance stands today.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE:

It shall be unlawful for any person to physically obstruct or block a person from entering or exiting a healthcare facility by physically striking, shoving, restraining, grabbing, or otherwise subjecting the person to unwanted physical contact or attempting or threatening to do the same.

It shall be unlawful for any person to obstruct or block the premises of a healthcare facility in a manner that impedes access to or from a healthcare facility, to block the driveway of a healthcare facility, or to engage in behavior that disrupts, blocks, obstructs, or interferes with pedestrian or vehicular traffic or the free passage of pedestrian or vehicular traffic into any driveway of a healthcare facility. Obstructing or blocking access to the premise of a healthcare facility or the driveway of a healthcare facility includes, but is not limited to, stopping or attempting to stop any vehicle for the purpose of soliciting or accepting contributions from the occupants of any vehicle or for the purpose of distributing merchandise or services to the occupants of any vehicle.

It shall be unlawful for any person to follow or harass a patient seeking to enter, entering, or leaving a healthcare facility within 100 feet of said healthcare facility. It is unlawful to engage in disorderly conduct within 100 feet of a healthcare facility. It is unlawful to engage in a course of conduct or repeatedly commit acts within 100 feet of the premises of a healthcare facility when that behavior places another person in reasonable fear of physical harm or attempting to do the same.

It shall be unlawful for any person to impersonate law enforcement personnel, a city official, or a healthcare professional within 100 feet of a healthcare facility. Impersonation of a law enforcement personnel or a city official includes, but is not limited to, engaging in conduct meant to confuse patients seeking medical treatment regarding street closures or providing false information in an attempt to direct a person seeking medical attention away from a healthcare facility. Impersonating a healthcare professional includes, but is not limited to, providing unsolicited medical advice in an unlicensed capacity.

It shall be unlawful for a parade permit to be issued for a location that is within 100 feet of a healthcare facility or for a route that includes a city street within 100 feet of a healthcare facility, unless issued to the owner or other authorized agent of the facility.

It shall be unlawful for an amplified sound permit to be issued for a location that is within 100 feet of a healthcare facility, unless issued to the owner or other authorized agent of the facility.

"Healthcare facility" as used in this section includes, but is not limited to, hospitals, physicians' offices, walk-in healthcare centers, healthcare diagnostic centers, surgical centers, and facilities which are licensed, certified or otherwise authorized to perform healthcare procedures in this state and to provide health services. "Healthcare facility" shall not include mobile healthcare facilities, residential homes, convalescent homes or other facilities that provide long-term residency.

It shall be the duty of the healthcare facility that wishes to be included under the scope of this ordinance to provide to City Council a letter certifying that they are in fact a healthcare facility as designated herein, the address of the facility, and the owner and any authorized agent(s) as applicable. City Council shall maintain these letters and check permit requests against addresses and facilities provided.

Larken,

As a follow-up to our meeting first week of April, attached is a draft of the Medical Facilities Safe Zone proposal. The draft is with several groups for review – Pro-Choice Charlotte, NARAL, the ACLU, and the Reproductive Rights Coalition. Happy to meet and discuss questions or concerns with you. There is a meeting scheduled for June 14th with City Council on this topic.

The proposal (starts on page 3) has been updated to expand from a reproductive healthcare facility buffer zone to a medical facilities safe zone. While some of these protections may exist in current city ordinances, in addition to the new protections the proposal includes, it's vital for all the protections to be included in one place for the purpose of providing specific guidance to CMPD on how to enforce the prohibitions in the context of a medical facility. I hope we can be really specific with the language on what "blocking, obstructing, or interfering" means and how it is enforced in the context of access to medical care. All patients seeking medical care are in a vulnerable state and should be protected from harassment and manipulation in pursuit of that care. There is

a higher degree of care in this context and, therefore, the language needs to reflect that.

The proposal also includes "opt in" language for all facilities. This allows the ordinance to be applied in a practical sense, such that all medical facilities would not come under the protection of the ordinance automatically. If a medical facility does not have a need or purpose for the protection, it can be waived. This will allow for CMPD to enforce the protection only where it is needed, i.e. where harassment and obstruction to medical access is taking place. Further, there is a carve out for permissibility of permits issued to the owner or agent of the facility. So, hopefully that provides enough "wiggle room" as to not result in unintended consequences.

Last, I included several examples of existing protections (starts on page 2). You will see that the SCOTUS decision in 2014 does nothing to render this type of protection unconstitutional. Instead, that decision strengthened the buffer zone that exists in New York (along with keeping others intact).

In the upcoming weeks, we will be meeting with medical facilities around Charlotte to ask for their support of the ordinance. Let me know if you would like to discuss prior to the 14th.

Larken,

As a follow-up to our meeting first week of April, attached is a draft of the Medical Facilities Safe Zone proposal. The draft is with several groups for review – Pro-Choice Charlotte, NARAL, the ACLU, and the Reproductive Rights Coalition. Happy to meet and

discuss questions or concerns with you. There is a meeting scheduled for June 14th with City Council on this topic.

The proposal (starts on page 3) has been updated to expand from a reproductive healthcare facility buffer zone to a medical facilities safe zone. While some of these protections may exist in current city ordinances, in addition to the new protections the proposal includes, it's vital for all the protections to be included in one place for the purpose of providing specific guidance to CMPD on how to enforce the prohibitions in the context of a medical facility. I hope we can be really specific with the language on what "blocking, obstructing, or interfering" means and how it is enforced in the context of access to medical care. All patients seeking medical care are in a vulnerable state and should be protected from harassment and manipulation in pursuit of that care. There is a higher degree of care in this context and, therefore, the language needs to reflect that.

The proposal also includes "opt in" language for all facilities. This allows the ordinance to be applied in a practical sense, such that all medical facilities would not come under the protection of the ordinance automatically. If a medical facility does not have a need or purpose for the protection, it can be waived. This will allow for CMPD to enforce the protection only where it is needed, i.e. where harassment and obstruction to medical access is taking place. Further, there is a carve out for permissibility of permits issued to the owner or agent of the facility. So, hopefully that provides enough "wiggle room" as to not result in unintended consequences.

Last, I included several examples of existing protections (starts on page 2). You will see that the SCOTUS decision in 2014 does nothing to render this type of protection unconstitutional. Instead, that decision strengthened the buffer zone that exists in New York (along with keeping others intact).

In the upcoming weeks, we will be meeting with medical facilities around Charlotte to ask for their support of the ordinance. Let me know if you would like to discuss prior to the 14th.

Council Member Harlow:

Some of us – all members of the Cherry Neighborhood - have previously opposed the proposed Rezoning Petition 2018-078, most recently speaking against the petition at the City Council Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. Since that time Conformity Corp. (Petitioner) has re-submitted their site plan (revision 3) for the rezoning, and has been in direct contact with some immediate Cherry neighbors.

Mr. Ritchey stated to us and others present at the City Council meeting of September 24th that he would be in touch with the Cherry Neighborhood to further discuss the rezoning plans and the wishes of the Cherry Neighborhood. No outreach has been forthcoming from Mr. Ritchey or Conformity Corp. to the Cherry neighborhood, despite Mr. Ritchey's assurances that this would take place.

We in the neighborhood are both perplexed and alarmed that despite acknowledgement of the legitimacy of our concerns about the proposed plan by planning staff, City Council members, and members of the Zoning Committee, the plan continues to be advanced through the process.

Although density is the stated reason for the rezoning petition, the issue is not density. Parking is an issue, even in Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3. But it is not the only problem with the application.

After reviewing Conformity's Site Plan Revision 3, we continue to oppose the Rezoning Petition, for the following reasons:

1. Public Safety

The proposed 20' wide "Private Drive" or alley proposed by Conformity Corp. does not allow for the entry of City emergency vehicles to the houses along the proposed "private drive" if even one vehicle is parked along this alley. This is both unacceptable and unnecessary. The only reason for the narrowness of the proposed "private drive" is Conformity Corp.'s desire to permit the building of four residences, rather than the three that would be permissible under the current zoning. The existing Storm and Sanitary sewer easements and adjoining homes constrain the ability to put four homes on the parcel without squeezing the street width. We understand the motivation, but do not accept that rezoning is appropriate when the only beneficiary is the Applicant. It would set a terrible precedent – if allowed, every real estate speculator or developer will pursue the same solution.

We have included in this email following photos taken as recently as Tuesday, October 9, showing traffic challenges with current parking at Waco and Ellison Streets, which are both considerably wider than Conformity's proposed 20'.

2. Safety of the eventual homeowners on the "Private Drive"

At the impromptu discussion following the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th, we challenged Mr. Ritchey with the following observation: If you are the owner of a house built on the proposed Lot 1 (at the end of the alley), and you drive your car into your garage or parking apron, how will you get out again? Even assuming that there are no other cars parked on the "private drive", the street must be wide enough for the homeowner to turn around. Even a reverse K-turn requires that the street be wider than the length of the vehicle, unless the vegetation along the alley is to be continually sacrificed.

A typical large SUV or light duty pickup e.g. a full bed Ford F-150 is longer than 20'. (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List of longest consumer road vehicles). That means that the homeowner would have to back over 100' just to get out of his/her garage or, alternatively, back into the driveway of a neighbor's house. If the resident is towing a boat or work trailer, maneuvering is not possible.

This flies in the face of reasonableness, and is a safety hazard. Mr. Ritchey, when challenged with this observation, stated that a vehicle turn-around study would be done. Has this been done and reviewed by City planning staff? We also challenged Mr. Ritchey to come up with a plan that utilized a cul-de- sac to provide turnaround space for both City emergency vehicles and the residents of the new subdivision. He said he would do so. Has City planning staff received this?

3. Insufficient infrastructure

Charlotte Water Department declined to approve the rezoning based on insufficient sanitary sewer capacity to support an additional four houses. To our knowledge, this has not been addressed in Site Plan revision 3. Has City planning staff cleared this obstacle?

4. Appropriateness for the neighborhood.

Petitioner argues for the rezoning by citing the Saussy Burbank homes that have been built in Cherry over the past several years. Those parcels were rezoned to higher density to accommodate more houses. However, those houses front on public streets, not on narrow alleys as the Petitioner proposes. Typically, even in urban densities, the preference is to place dwellings on streets with the front of the dwelling facing the street, NOT an alley. This point was strenuously made by Ed McKinney in explaining the reasons for not approving Revolve Residential's rezoning request in NoDa at the October 24 City Council zoning meeting. There is nothing else like this in Cherry. It would be unfortunate if this rezoning were approved, which would set a precedent for shoehorning new single-family houses into private alleys. There are follow-on issues of private alley maintenance, lighting, planting and more. Are "Private Drives" to be the future direction for Charlotte infill development?

5. No commitment to a Tree Save area between Lot 4 and Scott Baynes' property.

Mr. Ritchey stated, immediately following the September 24th meeting, that a future connection to Welker Avenue was possible. He also stated in the rezoning hearing of September 24th that the easement for the sanitary sewer line in this area had been improperly recorded. Hence utilizing this space for Tree Save was not possible.

Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3 shows "potential tree save area" of 5590 sf. None of that is in the area between Lot 4 and immediate neighbor Scott Bayne's property, where it is most needed. Much of the 5590 sf indicated as "potential tree save area" is already in the SWIM/PCSO buffer area, and hence is double counted. In any case only 2524.30 sf – less than half the amount shown on Conformity's Site Plan Revsion 3 - will actually be used. Logically the 2524.30 sf would be used between Lot 4 as shown and Scott Baynes' property. The SWIM/PCSO buffer already take care of tree save in that buffer.

Petitioner has stated during the rezoning process that it is keeping its options open for either a future fifth lot or a connection to other future lots. We cannot see how an implied fifth lot could be created without building over either a storm or sanitary sewer. This area should preferably have a conservation easement given its proximity to the creek and sewer lines running through it. Has Planning staff reviewed the alleged improper recordation of the sanitary sewer easement?

Conformity's rezoning plan, as shown on Revision 3, is no better, and in some ways worse, than Revision 2, discussed at the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. At this point we have little confidence that what have heard the whole truth from Conformity, since they have told us multiple, conflicting tales.

No one is challenging the merit or desirability of developing the parcel in question. What we do question is the continued lack of specificity and consistency from Conformity, and the fundamental basis for a rezoning of the parcel.

We believe that Conformity can put together a subdivision plan that meets the needs of both the Cherry neighborhood and the long-term goals of the City of Charlotte. However, we do not believe that residents of the City of Charlotte have an obligation to approve a substandard rezoning application solely to enrich Conformity Corp.

We recommend that the Rezoning Application be rejected, and further recommend that Petitioner meet with both interested Cherry residents and appropriate City planning staff, simultaneously, to discuss what alternatives are available.

Council Member Harlow:

I am writing to request that Rezoning Request 18-078, affecting Waco and Ellison Streets in the Historic Cherry neighborhood, not be approved until the developer responds to neighbors' specific concerns about the planned development. Said concerns, only some of which were documented in the attached notes from developer Monty Ritchey's meeting with residents on August 2, 2018, have not been addressed in his revised plan. They are as follows.

- 1. The developer plans to build a 20 foot private drive rather than reopen the abandoned portion of Waco Street as a full-sized street. On this private drive, which will not be accessible by emergency vehicles, sanitation trucks, or construction vehicles, he plans to build four 4-5 bedroom houses with single car garages. Charlotte Fire Department's comment on the rezoning request was "No parking on streets less than 26 clear width." This infrastructure is obviously inadequate and it will create major on-street parking problems on Waco and Ellison, which are already narrow and sometimes impassable for school buses sanitation trucks.
- 2. Charlotte Water comments regarding the development were as follows. does not concur with the rezoning based upon the limited project information available. It is recommended that the applicant contact the Charlotte Water New Services at (704) 432-2854 for further information and to discuss options regarding sanitary sewer system capacity. developer plans to develop a 20 ft wide private driveway instead of reopening the existing abandoned Waco Street a full-sized street. On this private drive, which will not be accessible by emergency vehicles, sanitation trucks, or construction vehicles, he plans to build four 4-5 bedroom houses with single car garages. Charlotte Fire Department's comment on the rezoning request was "No parking on streets less than 26 clear width." This infrastructure is obviously inadequate and it will create major on-street parking problems on Waco and Ellison, which are already narrow and sometimes impassable for school buses sanitation trucks.
 - 1. Charlotte Water Department's comments were as follows:

The proposed rezoning is located in an area that Charlotte Water has determined to have limited sanitary sewer system capacity. Charlotte Water does **not** concur with the rezoning based upon the limited project information available. It is recommended that the applicant contact the Charlotte Water New Services at (704) 432-2854 for further information and to discuss options regarding sanitary sewer system capacity proposed rezoning is located in an area that Charlotte Water has determined to have limited sanitary sewer system capacity.

2. Solomon Fortune noted in his staff comments that Lot 5 will be used for Tree Save **and** would be able to be used for another lot in the future. But the two statements seem contradictory based upon Section 21-93 of the General Tree Save requirements (subsection e):

(e) No structure will be allowed within ten (10) feet of the tree save area. A building restriction must be noted on the record plat in accordance with the Tree Ordinance Guidelines.

- 3. When the community met with the developer he admitted that he had not given any thought to the placement of trash dumpsters since sanitation vehicles would be unable to pick them up curbside for the four houses. Neighbors requested that he not create trash receptacle pick up/storage bins at the front of the development, but this is precisely what he is planning for
- 4. Similarly, neighbors requested that the developer place a communal mail kiosk at the rear of the development rather than at the front. He has declined to incorporate that request as well.
- 5. The developer acknowledged that he will be removing trees at the rear of the development that currently provide a visual and noise buffer between the homes on Baldwin and Waco and the business establishments and parking lot in Kings Court. We requested that he not remove the trees but he has not honored that request.

I have attached a picture of Ellison Street with cars parked on both sides of the street, taken just today. The measured distance between the two cars parked directly across from each other is a mere 13 feet, not wide enough for a garbage truck or a school bus to pass.

The reality is that the developer, in requesting approval of smaller lot sizes via less setback, is attempting to shoehorn four houses in a space that actually should accommodate no more than three. His original request was for *five* smaller lots, from which he was only dissuaded because of the sewage lines that run below that proposed fifth lot. Our understanding is that he is now contemplating using that lot as a parking pad for parking overflow for the four homeowners - yet another eyesore for the residents on that corner and in contradiction with the alleged Tree Save referenced above.

We appreciate the time that Planning staff took to meet with us and we understand the legal constraints limiting what they can and cannot say in support of our concerns. We only ask that for once, common sense, good planning, and the legitimate concerns of existing residents be balanced against developers' profits.

COMMUNITY MEETING REPORT

This Community Meeting Report is being filed with the Office of the City Clerk and the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Planning Commission pursuant to the provisions of the City of Charlotte Zoning Ordinance.

PERSONS AND ORGANIZATIONS CONTACTED WITH DATE AND EXPLANATION OF HOW CONTACTED:

A representative of the Petitioner mailed a written notice of the date, time and location of the Community Meeting to the individuals and organizations set out on <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto by depositing such notice in the U.S. mail on July 23, 2018. A copy of the written notice is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit B</u>.

DATE, TIME AND LOCATION OF MEETING:

The Community Meeting was held on Thursday, August 2, 2018 at 6:00 pm at Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, 517 Baldwin Avenue, Charlotte, NC 28204.

PERSONS IN ATTENDANCE AT MEETING (see attached copy of sign-in sheet):

The Community Meeting was attended by those individuals identified on the sign-in sheet attached hereto as <u>Exhibit C.</u> The Petitioner was represented at the Community Meeting by Monte Ritchey ("Ritchey") and Laura Nightingale ("Nightingale").

SUMMARY OF PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION:

The Petitioner's agent, Ritchey, welcomed the attendees and introduced the Petitioner's team. Ritchey indicated that the Petitioner proposed to rezone an approximately 0.74 acre site (the "Site") located at the end of Waco Street, near S. Kings Drive from the R-6 zoning district to UR-2(CD) zoning district. Ritchey explained the rezoning process in general and stated that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the rezoning request and the conditional site plan and respond to questions and concerns from nearby residents and property owners.

Ritchey then presented the site plan and pointed out various commitments made by the Petitioner. Ritchey briefly discussed how the lots proposed are laid out, the nature of the newly proposed private street/drive and the principal reason for the request. He stated that the principal reason for the request was to reduce the lot width requirement and that the lots were otherwise dimensionally compliant with the current zoning, R-6. He used the site plan submitted as part of the Petitioner's original submittal.

S. Bayne:

Q: Will there be 5 houses built? Does the application ask for 4 or 5 houses?

A: No, there will only be 4 houses.

Q: Is the Petitioner doing anything with Lot 5?

A: No. Nothing is planned as of now. Long term hold.

Q: How wide will the private road be?

A: 23 feet wide with a 4 foot sidewalk.

Q: Where will the owners of these houses park?

A: There will be a 1 car garage and a 20 feet deep driveway.

Q: What about additional parking for guests, multiple vehicles, etc.?

A: Will consider guest parking bays at the end of private street drive, if room. Will consider flaring drive pad to two cars.

R. Jacobs:

Q: What will be the SF of the houses? How many bedrooms?

A: Petitioner cannot answer. The houses will be built by an in-town builder. The houses will fit into the 32x65 footprint. Likely 4-5 bedrooms.

Q: Will Lot 5 be a cut through?

A: Potentially. But there are no plans for it now or near future. Would require other parcels that the Petitioner does not own or have negotiated. Petitioner volunteered that the city has requested that Lots 4 & 5 be combined.

Q: Would you have to cross the creek to get to Henley?

A: Yes, which would be very expensive due to bridge requirements (Army Corps of Engineers, etc.).

P. Allen:

Q: Can the Petitioner give an overview/comparison of setbacks to the other houses on Waco Street?

A: The other houses are likely 20 ft setbacks. These will be 14 ft setbacks; however, the streetscape will still work nicely.

Q: What are the side yards?

A: 5 feet side yards are a requirement of our plan due to the notes that we've placed on it. R-6 also requires 5 foot side yards.

Q: What are the rear yards?

A: Only 10' is required, but Petitioner anticipates at least 30 feet, due to the grade change from the logical building locations to the creek.

S. Bayne:

Q: What will happen to the trees in back?

A: Petitioner will not be working in that area and as a result, they will be saved. The Petitioner can compel the builder to keep those trees.

D. Sucherman:

Q: Concerned about the buffer next to Lot 1. Will they remove the trees?

A: Cannot answer definitively, but with only a 5'sideyard, it is more likely that only a hedgerow will be used. Petitioner can work to buffer the view to the Shopping Center at the end of the private drive however with either trees or architecture.

Q: What about city services like trash?

A: There will not be a dumpster. There will be roll outs (4 trash, 4 recycle). Concerns about having a bunch of cans on the road. Petitioner may be able to provide some screening.

Q: Where will the mailboxes be?

A: There will be a cluster box/kiosk, as now required by Post Office. Petitioner to show mail facility on plans.

P. Allen:

Q: How many houses are allowed in current zoning/by right?

A: 3 houses.

P. Roberts:

Q: How will you get into private road?

A: Side walk to be held at its existing elevation to slow traffic.

K. Gesmundo:

Q: Will the street be gated?

A: No.

Q: Will the private road be called Waco or something else?

A: Not sure. Community would like it to remain Waco or use something historical (Wallace Court?).

S. Bittle-Patton:

Concerned about parking on Waco & Ellison. Current road cannot accommodate more traffic. Buses and construction vehicles cannot make it through when people are parked on the road.

Called out error on technical notes (references 7/10 instead of 4/4) – see plans.

Response: Petitioner acknowledged mistake in technical notes. Will adjust notes.

Q: Can the rezoning be anything other than UR-2 CD?

A: The Petitioner can try to find something softer (least offensive district type?).

S. Pfahl:

Q: Will Lot 4 own Lot 5?

A: Not sure, but not likely. Petitioner plans to hold for long-term. City has requested they be combined.

Q: Will Petitioner combine Lot 4 and Lot 5? Can you commit it to tree save?

A: We plan to save trees, but cannot commit the area reflected at "Lot 5" to tree save.

B. Santanna:

Q: What are the short-term plans for Lot 5?

A: No short-term plans. There may be some utility work (Duke, etc.), but nothing from Petitioner.

Q: What are the side lots?

A: Same as the rest of the neighborhood. 5 feet side yards.

D. McKenzie:

Q: What will happen if Petitioner does not get the rezoning?

A: Either sell the 3 lots or hold for 2 years and try to rezone again.

D. Powell:

Q: If there were only 3 lots, would there be a private road?

A: No. All 3 driveways would be on the public road (Waco/Ellison).

Q: Can builder have 2 car garages instead of 1 car garage?

A: Will need to review and discuss with builder. May be able to have a 1 car garage, but a 2 car pad.

D. Sucherman:

Q: Time frame for rezoning and construction?

A: October vote on rezoning, convey lots likely in Jan. 2019, construction will begin almost immediately. Road will be built before construction begins.

Q: Can a hedgerow be planted next to private road?

A: Yes. Will suggest evergreens (screening/privacy).

Q: What will happen with all the power lines near Lot 5?

A: Likely transformers will come off poles and be placed on a pad (underground utilities), but cannot guarantee. Duke Energy engineering department will manage. Plan improves with utility improvements. Petitioner motivated by the same concerns as the neighborhood.

S. Bittle-Patton:

Q: Concerns about construction parking and access.

A: Offered to hold another meeting bringing in the builder to discuss construction parking concerns.

Q: When will the revised plans be up?

A: Petitioner must have submitted revised plans by August 13, 2018.

Reform Package Importance: High Kia and Mack – I hope this note finds you both well.

I'm writing to follow up on my note below, share some more of what we are learning about Opportunity Zones/Funds, and offer Purpose Built's help in seeking designation as an Opportunity Zone from the North Carolina Governor's office.

While it's unclear how successful Opportunity Funds will be at raising and deploying what could be billions in private equity, it is clear that the money can ONLY be deployed in designated Opportunity Zones. These Zones (really census tracts or contiguous census tracts) must be designated by each state's Governor by March 21, 2018. Each state can designate up to 25% of its low income census tracts as Opportunity Zones (and can include a small percentage of contiguous census tracts as well). The designation will last 10 years, and there will not be another window to designate tracts during that time.

Census tracts where Purpose Built Network Members are working are great candidates to be designated Opportunity Zones for the following reasons:

- 1. They meet the low-income criteria
- 2. They have already seen some public and private investment (they are "on the move") including from federal, place-based programs like NMTC and Promise or Choice
- 3. Most important, because of the planned capital investments that are part of being a Purpose Built Community, our neighborhoods can absorb the capital that will be deployed by the O Funds.

You may have already done some outreach to learn more about how the program will run in North Carolina. If so, <u>will</u> <u>you please share with the group copied here</u> so we can avoid duplicated effort? It's possible that no one at the state is even thinking about this (we're seeing this in other states), and we may be able to provide some access to good information for Governor's offices, etc. The timeline is very short, and this aspect of the law has not been well-publicized.

As we learn more about how North Carolina will make its designation, we would like to offer our help with making the case for Purpose Built Network Member sites to be included. <u>Please let us know if you think this will be helpful</u>. Our thought was to either offer a letter of support or to help you draft a letter of your own making the case for inclusion. Let us know what you think would be most useful.

One other note: We will also be learning more about the Opportunity Funds themselves and working with LIIF and some of our private sector partners to see if we should either encourage Network Members to create an O Fund or we should do so ourselves (or both). The certification process for O Funds has not been completed, but we have learned that Opportunity Funds can be either national or hyper-local in nature.

Hello Purpose Built Network EDs! – I wanted to be sure you all had the attached information about the Opportunity Zones Program that is part of the Tax Reform package that was enacted in late December.
In short, this Program is designed to drive long-term, private market capital to low-income urban and rural communities through a vehicle called an Opportunity Fund. Investments in the fund will offer tax deferment to investors for long-term capital gains, but no up-front tax credit. No public dollars are involved. There is still much that is not known about how the program will work, BUT one thing we do know is that Opportunity Fund Investments can only be made in designated OPPORTUNITY ZONES.
Opportunity Zones must be designated by the Governor of each State. They have just 90 days from the date of enactment of the law (12/22/17) to submit Opportunity Zone recommendations to the Treasury. I'm sure Governors will need to include a healthy mix of rural and urban census tracts and only 25% of tracts that qualify in a particular state can be designated.
We recommend you:

- 1. Learn about the program and get a sense of how the designations are going to be made in your state (Note: this is coming as a surprise to a lot of people and the deadline is fast approaching)
- 2. Determine how and whether census tracts in your neighborhood might be designated as part of an Opportunity Zone; and determine whether you want to seek this designation.

3. Stay tuned to learn more about the Opportunity Funds themselves. The social mission of these funds is a little murky at this moment. They could provide very helpful capital to our work or – if we aren't aware of what's happening or perhaps involved in creating such a Fund – they could work at cross-purposes with our mission of creating long-term affordability in our neighborhoods. It's unclear.

- U.S. investors are eligible to receive a temporary tax deferral and other tax benefits when they rollover unrealized capital gains into Opportunity Funds for a minimum of five years.
- Opportunity Funds are authorized to invest in Opportunity Zone Property:
 - o Stock in a domestic corporation
 - o Capital or profits interest in a domestic partnership
 - o Tangible property used in a trade or business of the Opportunity Fund that substantially improves the property.
- Governors have 90 days from the date of enactment (December 22, 2017) to submit Opportunity Zone recommendations to Treasury.
- Treasury has not released guidance on the process for certifying Opportunity Funds.
- Enterprise anticipates the Opportunity Zones Program will be fully implemented by Q4 2018 or Q1 2019. Many factors could influence this timeline. Look for additional coverage on Enterprise's blog.

OVERVIEW

Originally introduced in the <u>Investing in Opportunity Act</u> (IIOA), the Opportunity Zones Program was enacted as part of the 2017 tax reform package (<u>Tax Cuts and Jobs Act</u>). The program is designed to drive long-term capital to rural and low-income urban communities throughout the nation, and uses tax incentives to encourage private investment in impact funds.

BACKGROUND

In 2015, the Economic Innovation Group (EIG) – a bipartisan public policy firm – developed the Opportunity Zone concept, which was conceived as a systematic approach to helping address the uneven economic recovery and persistent lack of growth that have left too many American communities behind. The concept was introduced in the Investing in Opportunity Act (IIOA) during the 114th Congress, and reintroduced in the 115th Congress by Senators Tim Scott (R-S.C.) and Cory Booker (D-N.J.) and Congressmen Pat Tiberi (R-Ohio) and Ron Kind (D-Wis.), gaining nearly 100 congressional cosponsors in 2017.

This is the first new community development tax incentive program enacted since the Clinton administration, providing an opportunity for mainstream private investors to support businesses and distressed communities. The expectation is that Opportunity Funds will ease the execution of "impact investments" for investors, and tax benefits derived from these investments will incent participation in the Opportunity Zones Program.

DEFINITIONS

Here are high-level definitions of key terms. Each is discussed in further detail below.

Opportunity Zone: A census tract which has been designated as eligible to receive private investments through Opportunity Funds.

Opportunity Fund: Private investment vehicle, certified by the Treasury, to aggregate and deploy capital in Opportunity Zones for eligible uses defined as Opportunity Zone Property.

Opportunity Zone Property: Asset types eligible for investment under the Opportunity Zones Program.







PROGRAM DETAILS

Opportunity Zones Program

The Opportunity Zones Program has been introduced as an <u>innovative approach</u> to unlocking long-term private investment to support low-income urban and rural communities in every U.S. state and territory.

Investors are eligible to receive certain tax benefits on unrealized capital gains reinvested in Opportunity Zones through pooled Opportunity Funds. The program is designed to minimize cost and risk to the taxpayer. Investors bear the risk on all their originally deferred capital gains, minus a modest reduction for long-term holdings, regardless of whether subsequent investments have increased or decreased in value. Neither tax credits nor public-sector financing is involved.

Opportunity Zones

The program uses low-income community census tracts as the basis for determining areas eligible for an Opportunity Zone designation. [Section 45D(e)].

- · Low-income census tracts are places with an individual poverty rate of at least 20 percent and median family income no greater than 80 percent of the area median.
- A census tract that is not a low-income community may be designated as a qualified Opportunity Zone if the tract is contiguous with the low-income community designated as a qualified Opportunity Zone, and the median family income of the tract does not exceed 125 percent of the median family income of the low-income community contiguous with the tract. Up to 5 percent of the population census tracts designated as Opportunity Zones may qualify under this exemption.
- Per state/territory, up to 25 percent of the total number of census tracts that qualify as an Opportunity Zone can be designated as an Opportunity Zone.

Governors will determine which low-income community census tracts qualify as an Opportunity Zone. This approach was intended to help ensure local needs and opportunities are being met as well as to encourage concentration of capital in targeted, geographically contiguous areas in each state or territory.

- · Governors have 90 days (Determination Period) from the date of enactment to submit a list of designated census tracts for approval.
 - o Treasury must approve or provide feedback within 30 days of the governor's submission (Consideration Period).
 - o Both the Determination Period and Consideration Period can be extended for a period of 30 days.
 - o Opportunity Zone designations last for a period of 10 years (Designation Period).

Opportunity Funds

Opportunity Funds are a new class of investment vehicles (organized as a corporation or a partnership) that specialize in aggregating private investment and deploying that capital in Opportunity Zones to support Opportunity Zone Property.

- A minimum of 90 percent of Opportunity Fund assets must be invested in Opportunity Zones.
- Opportunity Funds are envisioned as a market solution for investors who lack the information and wherewithal to execute investments in rural and low-income urban communities.
- The statute does not limit the number of funds that can be created, nor does it provide instruction on the nature of investments (i.e., risk/return profile).
- Pooling capital through a fund structure provides an opportunity for a broad array of investors throughout the country to engage in the program.





Opportunity Zones Property

Opportunity Funds invest in Opportunity Zone Property, which are defined as:

- Qualified opportunity zone stock any stock in a domestic corporation
- Qualified opportunity zone partnership interest any capital or profits interest in a domestic partnership
- Qualified opportunity zone business property tangible property used in a trade or business of the qualified opportunity fund that substantially improves the property

Incentives for Activating Passive Holdings

The Opportunity Zones Program provides an incentive for investors to reinvest unrealized capital gains into Opportunity Funds in exchange for a temporary tax deferral and other benefits tied to long-term holdings. With trillions of dollars in unrealized capital gains sitting on the sidelines in stocks and mutual funds, U.S. investors can now roll passive holdings of capital into investments in distressed communities.

No upfront subsidy is provided to investors; all incentives are linked to the duration of the qualified investment. The provision has two main tax incentives to encourage investment:

- Allows for the temporary deferral of inclusion in gross income for capital gains that are reinvested into Opportunity Funds.
 - o Investors can roll existing capital gains into Opportunity Funds with no up-front tax bill.
 - o If investors hold their Opportunity Fund investments for five years, the basis of their original investment is increased by 10 percent (meaning they will only owe taxes on 90 percent of the rolled-over capital gains). If investors hold for seven years, the basis increases by a further 5 percent.
 - o Investors can defer their original tax bill until December 31, 2026 at the latest, or until they sell their Opportunity Fund investments, if earlier.
- Excludes from taxable income capital gains on Opportunity Fund investments held for at least 10 years. In other words, after settling their original tax bill, patient investors in Opportunity Funds will face no capital gains taxes on their Opportunity Zone investments.

Required Impact Reporting

The provision requires Treasury to report annually to Congress on the Opportunity Zone incentives beginning five years after the date of enactment. The report is to include an assessment of investments held by the Opportunity Fund nationally and at the state level.

- To the extent the information is available, the report is to include:
 - Number of Opportunity Funds
 - o Amount of assets held in Opportunity Funds
 - o Composition of Opportunity Fund investments by asset class
 - o Percentage of Opportunity Zones that have received investments
- The report also must provide an assessment of the impacts and outcomes of the investments in economic indicator areas, including job creation, poverty reduction and new business starts, and other metrics as determined by the secretary.

STEPS TOWARD IMPLEMENTATION

As explained below, there are currently multiple efforts happening in tandem as the administration and states work to implement the Opportunity Zones Program, including: 1) designating Opportunity Zones, 2) providing guidance on Opportunity Fund certification, and 3) finalizing the law.

Designating Opportunity Zones

Each governor is authorized to designate a certain number of Opportunity Zones into which private investment can flow through Opportunity Funds. Governors have 90 days from the date of enactment (December 22, 2017) to submit a list of designated census tracts for approval, although they can request a 30-day extension. Once approved, these designations will remain in place for 10 years.

Currently, governors are awaiting guidance from Treasury regarding the process for submitting recommended designations. It is anticipated that this guidance will be delivered in the coming weeks (late January/early February 2018).

Providing Guidance on Opportunity Fund Certification

Once the zones are designated, Treasury will turn its focus to providing guidance on Opportunity Fund certification. The statute outlines two requirements regarding structure and intent of these funds: 1) must be organized as a corporation or a partnership and 2) invest a minimum of 90 percent of assets in Opportunity Zones. Given the straightforward nature of statute requirements, it is unclear whether additional qualifications will be considered. It is anticipated that the process for certification will analogue that of a Community Development Entity (CDE). The timeline for the availability of the guidance is not yet known.

Finalizing the Law

In addition to providing guidance on the processes for submitting Opportunity Zone designations and certifying Opportunity Funds, the Treasury must follow formal administrative procedures to finalize the law, which will dictate ongoing administration of the Opportunity Zones Program. The process typically goes as follows:

- Treasury will propose a structure for implementing the new rule, after which it will issue a notice of proposed rulemaking and will request public comments on the proposal.
- The comment period typically lasts from 30 to 60 days. Upon reviewing the comments and making any necessary changes to the rule, Treasury will issue a final rule that formalizes the program.

Final Implementation: Q4 2018 - Q1 2019

Given the scope of activities noted above, Enterprise anticipates implementation in Q4 2018 or Q1 2019. A number of factors could influence this timeline, so stay tuned for additional coverage of the implementation of the Opportunity Zones Program on Enterprise's blog.



Mayor Lyles:

I am writing to request that Rezoning Request 18-078, affecting Waco and Ellison Streets in the Historic Cherry neighborhood, not be approved until the developer responds to neighbors' specific concerns about the planned development. Said concerns, only some of which were documented in the attached notes from developer Monty Ritchey's meeting with residents on August 2, 2018, have not been addressed in his revised plan. They are as follows.

- 1. The developer plans to build a 20 foot private drive rather than reopen the abandoned portion of Waco Street as a full-sized street. On this private drive, which will not be accessible by emergency vehicles, sanitation trucks, or construction vehicles, he plans to build four 4-5 bedroom houses with single car garages. Charlotte Fire Department's comment on the rezoning request was "No parking on streets less than 26 clear width." This infrastructure is obviously inadequate and it will create major on-street parking problems on Waco and Ellison, which are already narrow and sometimes impassable for school buses sanitation trucks.
- 2. Charlotte Water comments regarding the development were as follows. does not concur with the rezoning based upon the limited project information available. It is recommended that the applicant contact the Charlotte Water New Services at (704) 432-2854 for further information and to discuss options regarding sanitary sewer system capacity. developer plans to develop a 20 ft wide private driveway instead of reopening the existing abandoned Waco Street a full-sized street. On this private drive, which will not be accessible by emergency vehicles, sanitation trucks, or construction vehicles, he plans to build four 4-5 bedroom houses with single car garages. Charlotte Fire Department's comment on the rezoning request was "No parking on streets less than 26 clear width." This infrastructure is obviously inadequate and it will create major on-street parking problems on Waco and Ellison, which are already narrow and sometimes impassable for school buses sanitation trucks.
 - 1. Charlotte Water Department's comments were as follows:

The proposed rezoning is located in an area that Charlotte Water has determined to have limited sanitary sewer system capacity. Charlotte Water does not concur with the rezoning

based upon the limited project information available. It is recommended that the applicant contact the Charlotte Water New Services at (704) 432-2854 for further information and to discuss options regarding sanitary sewer system capacity proposed rezoning is located in an area that Charlotte Water has determined to have limited sanitary sewer system capacity.

2. Solomon Fortune noted in his staff comments that Lot 5 will be used for Tree Save **and** would be able to be used for another lot in the future. But the two statements seem contradictory based upon Section 21-93 of the General Tree Save requirements (subsection e):

(e) No structure will be allowed within ten (10) feet of the tree save area. A building restriction must be noted on the record plat in accordance with the Tree Ordinance Guidelines.

- 3. When the community met with the developer he admitted that he had not given any thought to the placement of trash dumpsters since sanitation vehicles would be unable to pick them up curbside for the four houses. Neighbors requested that he not create trash receptacle pick up/storage bins at the front of the development, but this is precisely what he is planning for
- 4. Similarly, neighbors requested that the developer place a communal mail kiosk at the rear of the development rather than at the front. He has declined to incorporate that request as well.
- 5. The developer acknowledged that he will be removing trees at the rear of the development that currently provide a visual and noise buffer between the homes on Baldwin and Waco and the business establishments and parking lot in Kings Court. We requested that he not remove the trees but he has not honored that request.

I have attached a picture of Ellison Street with cars parked on both sides of the street, taken just today. The measured distance between the two cars parked directly across from each other is a mere 13 feet, not wide enough for a garbage truck or a school bus to pass.

The reality is that the developer, in requesting approval of smaller lot sizes via less setback, is attempting to shoehorn four houses in a space that actually should accommodate no more than three. His original request was for *five* smaller lots, from which he was only dissuaded because of the sewage lines that run below that proposed fifth lot. Our understanding is that he is now contemplating using that lot as a parking pad for parking overflow for the four homeowners - yet another eyesore for the residents on that corner and in contradiction with the alleged Tree Save referenced above.

We appreciate the time that Planning staff took to meet with us and we understand the legal constraints limiting what they can and cannot say in support of our concerns. We only ask that for once, common sense, good planning, and the legitimate concerns of existing residents be balanced against developers' profits.



Council Member Mayfield:

Some of us – all members of the Cherry Neighborhood - have previously opposed the proposed Rezoning Petition 2018-078, most recently speaking against the petition at the City Council Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. Since that time Conformity Corp. (Petitioner) has re-submitted their site plan (revision 3) for the rezoning, and has been in direct contact with some immediate Cherry neighbors.

Mr. Ritchey stated to us and others present at the City Council meeting of September 24th that he would be in touch with the Cherry Neighborhood to further discuss the rezoning plans and the wishes of the Cherry Neighborhood. No outreach has been forthcoming from Mr. Ritchey or Conformity Corp. to the Cherry neighborhood, despite Mr. Ritchey's assurances that this would take place.

We in the neighborhood are both perplexed and alarmed that despite acknowledgement of the legitimacy of our concerns about the proposed plan by planning staff, City Council members, and members of the Zoning Committee, the plan continues to be advanced through the process.

Although density is the stated reason for the rezoning petition, the issue is not density. Parking is an issue, even in Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3. But it is not the only problem with the application.

After reviewing Conformity's Site Plan Revision 3, we continue to oppose the Rezoning Petition, for the following reasons:

1. Public Safety

The proposed 20' wide "Private Drive" or alley proposed by Conformity Corp. does not allow for the entry of City emergency vehicles to the houses along the proposed "private drive" if even one vehicle is parked along this alley. This is both unacceptable and unnecessary. The only reason for the narrowness of the proposed "private drive" is Conformity Corp.'s desire to permit the building of four residences, rather than the three that would be permissible under the current zoning. The existing Storm and Sanitary sewer easements and adjoining homes constrain the ability to put four homes on the parcel without squeezing the street width. We understand the motivation, but do not accept that rezoning is appropriate when the only beneficiary is the Applicant. It would set a terrible precedent – if allowed, every real estate speculator or developer will pursue the same solution.

We have included in this email following photos taken as recently as Tuesday, October 9, showing traffic challenges with current parking at Waco and Ellison Streets, which are both considerably wider than Conformity's proposed 20'.

2. Safety of the eventual homeowners on the "Private Drive"

At the impromptu discussion following the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th, we challenged Mr. Ritchey with the following observation: If you are the owner of a house built on the proposed Lot 1 (at the end of the alley), and you drive your car into your garage or parking apron, how will you get out again? Even assuming that there are no other cars parked on the "private drive", the street must be wide enough for the homeowner to turn around. Even a reverse K-turn requires that the street be wider than the length of the vehicle, unless the vegetation along the alley is to be continually sacrificed.

A typical large SUV or light duty pickup e.g. a full bed Ford F-150 is longer than 20'. (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List of longest consumer road vehicles). That means that the homeowner would have to back over 100' just to get out of his/her garage or, alternatively, back into the driveway of a neighbor's house. If the resident is towing a boat or work trailer, maneuvering is not possible.

This flies in the face of reasonableness, and is a safety hazard. Mr. Ritchey, when challenged with this observation, stated that a vehicle turn-around study would be done. Has this been done and reviewed by City planning staff? We also challenged Mr. Ritchey to come up with a plan that utilized a cul-de- sac to provide turnaround space for both City emergency vehicles and the residents of the new subdivision. He said he would do so. Has City planning staff received this?

3. Insufficient infrastructure

Charlotte Water Department declined to approve the rezoning based on insufficient sanitary sewer capacity to support an additional four houses. To our knowledge, this has not been addressed in Site Plan revision 3. Has City planning staff cleared this obstacle?

4. Appropriateness for the neighborhood.

Petitioner argues for the rezoning by citing the Saussy Burbank homes that have been built in Cherry over the past several years. Those parcels were rezoned to higher density to accommodate more houses. However, those houses front on public streets, not on narrow alleys as the Petitioner proposes. Typically, even in urban densities, the preference is to place dwellings on streets with the front of the dwelling facing the street, NOT an alley. This point was strenuously made by Ed McKinney in explaining the reasons for not approving Revolve Residential's rezoning request in NoDa at the October 24 City Council zoning meeting. There is nothing else like this in Cherry. It would be unfortunate if this rezoning were approved, which would set a precedent for shoehorning new single-family houses into private alleys. There are follow-on issues of private alley maintenance, lighting, planting and more. Are "Private Drives" to be the future direction for Charlotte infill development?

5. No commitment to a Tree Save area between Lot 4 and Scott Baynes' property.

Mr. Ritchey stated, immediately following the September 24th meeting, that a future connection to Welker Avenue was possible. He also stated in the rezoning hearing of September 24th that the easement for the sanitary sewer line in this area had been improperly recorded. Hence utilizing this space for Tree Save was not possible.

Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3 shows "potential tree save area" of 5590 sf. None of that is in the area between Lot 4 and immediate neighbor Scott Bayne's property, where it is most needed. Much of the 5590 sf indicated as "potential tree save area" is already in the SWIM/PCSO buffer area, and hence is double counted. In any case only 2524.30 sf – less than half the amount shown on Conformity's Site Plan Revsion 3 - will actually be used. Logically the 2524.30 sf would be used between Lot 4 as shown and Scott Baynes' property. The SWIM/PCSO buffer already take care of tree save in that buffer.

Petitioner has stated during the rezoning process that it is keeping its options open for either a future fifth lot or a connection to other future lots. We cannot see how an implied fifth lot could be created without building over either a storm or sanitary sewer. This area should preferably have a conservation easement given its proximity to the creek and sewer lines running through it. Has Planning staff reviewed the alleged improper recordation of the sanitary sewer easement?

Conformity's rezoning plan, as shown on Revision 3, is no better, and in some ways worse, than Revision 2, discussed at the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. At this point we have little confidence that what have heard the whole truth from Conformity, since they have told us multiple, conflicting tales.

No one is challenging the merit or desirability of developing the parcel in question. What we do question is the continued lack of specificity and consistency from Conformity, and the fundamental basis for a rezoning of the parcel.

We believe that Conformity can put together a subdivision plan that meets the needs of both the Cherry neighborhood and the long-term goals of the City of Charlotte. However, we do not believe that residents of the City of Charlotte have an obligation to approve a substandard rezoning application solely to enrich Conformity Corp.

We recommend that the Rezoning Application be rejected, and further recommend that Petitioner meet with both interested Cherry residents and appropriate City planning staff, simultaneously, to discuss what alternatives are available.

Council Member Phipps:

Some of us – all members of the Cherry Neighborhood - have previously opposed the proposed Rezoning Petition 2018-078, most recently speaking against the petition at the City Council Rezoning Hearing on September 24th. Since that time Conformity Corp. (Petitioner) has re-submitted their site plan (revision 3) for the rezoning, and has been in direct contact with some immediate Cherry neighbors.

Mr. Ritchey stated to us and others present at the City Council meeting of September 24th that he would be in touch with the Cherry Neighborhood to further discuss the rezoning plans and the wishes of the Cherry Neighborhood. No outreach has been forthcoming from Mr. Ritchey or Conformity Corp. to the Cherry neighborhood, despite Mr. Ritchey's assurances that this would take place.

We in the neighborhood are both perplexed and alarmed that *despite acknowledgement of the legitimacy of our concerns about the proposed plan by planning staff, City Council members,* and members of the Zoning Committee, the plan continues to be advanced through the process.

Although density is the stated reason for the rezoning petition, the issue is not density. Parking is an issue, even in Petitioner's Site Plan Revision 3. But it is not the only problem with the application.

After reviewing Conformity's Site Plan Revision 3, we continue to oppose the Rezoning Petition, for the following reasons:

1. Public Safety

The proposed 20' wide "Private Drive" or alley proposed by Conformity Corp. does not allow for the entry of City emergency vehicles to the houses along the proposed "private drive" if even one vehicle is parked along this alley. This is both unacceptable and unnecessary. The only reason for the narrowness of the proposed "private drive" is Conformity Corp.'s desire to permit the building of four residences, rather than the three that would be permissible under the current zoning. The existing Storm and Sanitary sewer easements and adjoining homes constrain the ability to put four homes on the parcel without squeezing the street width. We understand the motivation, but do not accept that rezoning is appropriate when the only beneficiary is the Applicant. It would set a terrible precedent – if allowed, every real estate speculator or developer will pursue the same solution.

We have included in this email following photos taken as recently as Tuesday, October 9, showing traffic challenges with current parking at Waco and Ellison Streets, which are both considerably wider than Conformity's proposed 20'.

2. Safety of the eventual homeowners on the "Private Drive"

At the impromptu discussion following the Rezoning Hearing on September 24th, we challenged Mr. Ritchey with the following observation: If you are the owner of a house built on the proposed Lot 1 (at the end of the alley), and you drive your car into your garage or parking apron, how will you get out again? Even assuming that there are no other cars parked on the "private drive", the street must be wide enough for the homeowner to turn around. Even a reverse K-turn requires that the street be wider than the length of the vehicle, unless the vegetation along the alley is to be continually sacrificed.
