Understanding of the project: As a result of water and sewer construction performed by the Charlotte Water, this contract is for various tree and vegetation removal. Carolina Tree Care acknowledges that the Charlotte Water Project Manager or their designee shall indicate and designate all trees, shrubs, plants and other objects that are to remain or be removed.

Summary of approach to be undertaken to perform services: Carolina Tree Care's approach includes raking the work area and match existing grade to smooth even surfaces. Remove trees and shrubs and haul from the job site, grind the remaining tree stumps and sweep up excess debris and haul from job site.

Summary of costs:

Per square yard without equipment: 1.15 per square yard. Per Square yard with equipment: 1.55 per square yard.

3. SCOPE OF TREE REMOVAL SERVICES.

3.1. General Scope.

As a result of water and sewer construction performed by Charlotte Water, this contract is for various tree and vegetation removal. The Charlotte Water Project Manager or their designee shall indicate and designate all trees, shrubs, plants and other objects that are to remain or be removed. Any damage to natural terrain, vegetation or objects designated to remain shall be immediately repaired or replaced as determined by Charlotte Water's Project Manager, at Carolina Tree Care's expense.

Carolina Tree Care will perform the following:

- Rake work area and match existing grade to a smooth even surface
- · Removal of trees/shrubs and haul from job site
- Grinding of remaining tree stumps
- Sweep up any excess debris and haul from job site

3.2. License, Bonding, and Insurance

Carolina Tree Care is familiar with all Federal, State, and local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations that in any manner affect the work.

Carolina Tree Care has provided a general Service Provider License, bonded and insured information: See attached.

3.3. Repair Locations

Repair location(s) will be within Charlotte Water's domain and defined by a Charlotte Water Project Manager. Should Carolina Tree Care be requested to perform work outside of the agreed upon location, Charlotte Water Project Manager must be contacted for written approval. Any repair services that are done without written approval will be at the expense of the service provider and will not be reimbursed by the City.

3.3.1 Clean-Up Work

Carolina Tree Care will ensure that each work site is completely cleaned up at the end of each day/ The clean-up work shall include washing streets with high pressure water when necessary, removing debris, and removing equipment from the site as necessary.

3.3.2 Noise Control

Carolina Tree Care will take steps to avoid the creation of excessive sound levels for employees, the public, or the site and adjacent property owners.

3.3.3 Carolina Tree Care will not bury or burn, brush, stumps, or debris



3.3.4 Trees, limbs, and debris shall be immediately removed from streams, ditches, and wet areas using methods that will minimize dragging or scarring the banks or stream bottom.

3.4. Frequency of Services

Services will be requested on an as needed basis. Although estimated utilization is provided on the price sheet, these numbers do not guarantee work based on those estimates.

3.5. Materials

Charlotte Water will not be responsible for furnishing any materials under this Agreement. Carolina Tree Care is responsible for providing all materials required for the provision of Services.

Charlotte Water reserves the right to inspect the condition of the equipment to be used.

3.6. Carolina Tree Care Service Responsibilities

- Carolina Tree Care shall be responsible for contacting the One-Call Center in order for all utility lines to appropriately be marked prior to any excavation services being performed.
- Carolina Tree Care will dig with care when approaching the location of the
 utilities lines, at such time hand tools or vacuum excavations techniques would
 need to be implemented to expose the utilities. Carolina Tree Care will be aware
 of abandoned lines as they can be utilized at a later date by the City.
- If holes cannot be filled with soil or grindings immediately upon excavation by Carolina Tree Care, the task must be completed within a 24 hour period after excavation is complete. Carolina Tree Care will not leave site until safety barricades are placed around hole for pedestrian and vehicular safety.
- Carolina Tree Care shall be responsible for notifying in writing, the City Project Manager should a hole not be able to be filled during the initial Service request call within four (4) hours of initial Service Request call.
- All debris from tree removal will be cleaned up and removed before the work crew leaves the site unless given permission by the City to do otherwise. All lawn areas shall be raked, all streets and sidewalks swept, and all brush, branches, and logs shall be removed from the site. Areas are to be left in a condition equal to that which existed prior to the commencement of tree removal operations. Stump grindings not used in the backfilling of stump holes will be removed from site
- Unless directed otherwise it will be the responsibility of Carolina Tree Care to remove and dispose of all logs, brush, and debris resulting from the tree removal operations at no additional cost to the City of Charlotte.

3.7. Liability for Damage to Property and/or Plant Material

 Should any damage caused by the Carolina Tree Care, it will be repaired immediately, at no additional cost to the City.

- Carolina Tree Care is responsible for ensuring that all Services are performed
 in a safe and responsible manner. Any damage done to either City of
 Charlotte property or private property will be the responsibility of the Carolina
 Tree Care to repair or to make arrangements to repair with City of Charlotte's
 approval. This will be done prior to final payment issuance.
- Carolina Tree Care acknowledges that damage to property and plant material must be corrected prior to leaving the job site.

3.8. Supervision

City Supervision: Carolina Tree Care acknowledges that the Proposed Agreement resulting from this RFP will be under the direct supervision of the City of Charlotte or its authorized representative. Any alterations or modification of the Services performed under this Agreement shall be made only by written agreement between the Carolina Tree Care and the City of Charlotte and shall be made prior to the commencement of the altered work. No claims for extra work or materials will be allowed unless covered by written agreement and signed by both parties.

Work Crew Supervision: Carolina Tree Care will provide qualified supervision of each crew at all times while working under this Agreement. This will occur with a foreman present at each crew. Each supervisor will be authorized by Carolina Tree Care to accept and act upon all directives issued by the City.

3.9. Service Locations

Trees and vegetation will be situated at various locations as designated by the City Project Manager.

3.10. Service Times

Carolina Tree Care acknowledges normal business hours for Tree Removal Services will be Monday - Friday 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., except during holidays as designated by the City of Charlotte. Emergency Service may be required on an as-needed basis to perform Services after-hours, on holidays and weekends.

Carolina Tree Care will provide a flat hourly rate for emergency services outside normal business hours to include all workmen and repair services.

Carolina Tree Care will complete jobs within seven (7) days of receiving notification of mobilization. Should a repair require urgent attention, the Charlotte Water Project Manager shall notify Carolina Tree Care that the situation should be given top priority and the need for the job to be completed in a timely manner. Carolina Tree Care is prepared to work with both Charlotte Water staff and the private property owners with regards to scheduling work.

Carolina Tree Care will supply a list of two employee names and telephone numbers for emergency service and must provide updates to this list to the City Project Manager as changes occur.

3.11. Safety and Equipment.

3.11.1 Safety

Carolina Tree Care adheres to all safety procedures mentioned below; employees shall wear all O.S.H.A. required safety equipment while working at sites. All equipment to be used and all work to be performed shall be in full compliance with the most current revision

of the American National Standards Institute, Standard Z-133.1 "Safety Requirements for Pruning, Trimming, Repairing, Maintenance, and Removing and for Cutting Brush". These standards are made part of the Agreement by way of this reference.

Carolina Tree Care will be solely responsible for worker, pedestrian, and vehicular safety and shall provide warning devices, barricades and ground personnel needed to provide safety, protection and warning to person(s) and/or vehicular traffic within the area in accordance with the City of Charlotte WATCH hand book.

Additionally, a Personal Protective Equipment List is included below which outlines the NC O.S.H.A. vs. the Charlotte Water requirements while performing excavations and trenching. Carolina Tree Care will strictly adhere to the Charlotte Water requirements on every job they are called to provide Service for. Should Service personner deviate from the below referenced requirements they may be asked to cease work until appropriate safety attire is worn. Any portion of work that results in over-time due to the above mentioned situation shall not be billed to the City but shall be absorbed by the Service Provider.

3.11.2 Overhead High Voltage Line Safety

The Service Provider shall note that the services may be located near existing high voltage lines. The utility owner shall make all necessary arrangements with the various utilities to protect lines and the public. Charlotte Water and the Service Provider shall adhere to the provisions of ARTICLE 19A: OVERHEAD HIGH VOLTAGE LINE SAFETY ACT-State Statue 95-229, as amended and became effective January 1, 1999. All costs associated with the service provider's responsibilities under this act are included in the various items of this agreement

3.11.3 Work Crew Supervision.

Carolina Tree Care will provide qualified supervision of each crew at all time while working under this contract. Each supervisor shall be authorized by the service provider to accept and act upon all directives issued by the city.

Carolina Tree Care will notify City Arborist or designee of three(s) that have a major defect that may present a hazard to the public.



3.11.4 Traffic Control.

Carolina Tree Care will be thoroughly familiar with the June 2006 edition of the Work Area Traffic Control Handbook (WATCH), which will be provided to Service Provider upon award of Agreement. All traffic control devices and procedures shall conform to the requirements of the WATCH handbook;

• Beginning work and Street Closures

Carolina Tree Care will notify the Transportation Engineering Division of Charlotte Department of Transportation in accordance with section IV of the WATCH Handbook of any work where the number of travel lanes is reduced from normal conditions.

• Right of Way Use Permit:

Carolina Tree Care will not be responsible for obtaining the Right of Way Use Permit from Charlotte Department of Transportation for approval to work in the street rights of way. This task shall be perfolmed by the Charlotte Water.

• Traffic Control Plan:

Traffic control will be performed by Carolina Tree Care based upon the Traffic Control Special Provisions. The Traffic Control Special Provisions may refer to details in the WATCH Handbook.

• Maintenance of Traffic:

Carolina Tree Care will maintain all travel lanes in accordance with the WATCH handbook diagrams.

• Traffic Control Phasing:

The Contactor shall use flagger control in accordance with the WATCH handbook diagrams referenced in the Traffic Control Phasing and with Sections XV and XVI of the WATCH handbook.

Carolina Tree Care will mark all hazards within the project limits with well-maintained signs, barricades, warning and/or channelizing devices.

3.11.6Licensing

Carolina Tree Care will possess and keep in force all licenses and permits required to perform the Services as specified in this proposal.

Carolina Tree Care's maintenance and service personnel shall be trained and experienced in Tree Removal Services specified in this proposal.

3.12.

Regardless of exceptions taken, Service Providers shall provide pricing based on the requirements and terms set forth in this RFP. Pricing must be all-inclusive and cover every aspect of the Project. Cost must be in United States dollars rounded to the nearest quarter of a dollar. A pricing worksheet is provided in Section 7, Folm 4 to assist you.

3.13. Pay Item Descriptions:

1: WORK ORDER MOBILIZATION

Description: Mobilization shall include a site visit by Carolina Tree Care. Carolina Tree Care will generate a detailed written assessment of the work to be done, including equipment required and unit of measure per Pay Item Descriptions for the specific work site. Written work assessment shall be given to Charlotte Water's project manager or designee. Charlotte Water's Project Manager or designee shall provide written approval prior to work being done. Once approval has been provided to the Service Provider, service provider, work crew, and necessary equipment/supplies may begin work. Failure to provide written assessment or obtain approval prior to doing work shall not entitle Service Provider to be paid.

Measurement and Payment: Mobilization will be paid for as unit price for each project issued though its completion. Such price and payment includes but is not limited to written assessment, site visit(s), meeting with Charlotte Water's Project Manager or designee, the movement of personnel, equipment, supplies, and incidentals 1 lecessaly for work on the project; the removal and disbandment of those personnel, equipment, supplies, incidentals, or other facilities that were established for the prosecution of work on the project; and for all other work and operations that

shall be performed for costs incurred prior to beginning work on the various items on the project site. Include bonding and other costs to comply with the contract requirements not paid under other payment items in mobilization. Only one mobilization payment shall be made for each project.

Unit of Measure shall be measured by the following: Each (EA).

Payment shall be made on the basis of the unit price on the Price Worksheet.

2: STUMP GRINDING

Description: All stump grinding shall consist of grinding the tree stump to a minimum depth of 18" below the surface, removing the debris, backfilling hole with clean dirt and cleaning the site of any waste. Shall include at least a two man crew, chipper, and large crew truck.

Stump Grinding operations shall be accomplished with equipment and methods acceptable in n01mal arboricultural operations in accordance with ANSI 2133.1 especially section 6.5: Stump Grinding.

Unit of Measure shall be measured as each (EA)
Payment shall be made on the basis of the unit price on the Price Worksheet.

3: TREEREMOVAL

Carolina Tree Care will refrain from the practice of "free falling" the trees. All trees shall be limed out prior to the final cutting of the trunk. All manmade structures shall always be protected from the impact of falling wood used of the tree or limb ground supports. Ropes or other mechanical devices shall be used to lower all limbs of sufficient size that may cause damage to other trees/bushes/plants or surrounding public or private property.

Service Provider shall be experienced in the removal of trees in accordance with standards set for the by the arboriculture industry as specified in ANSI 2133.1 especially sections 6.7 Long Loaders, Cranes and Related Hoists, 9.4 Lowering Limbs and 9.5 Tree Removal

All limbs 8" – 16" shall be lowered to the ground through the use of lowering ropes, pulleys or cranes so as to prevent branches and trunks from falling and creating damage to adjacent homes, driveways, sidewalks, trees, shrubs, streets, and other property both public and private. All limbs 16" or greater shall be removed solely through the use of a crane; minimum 25 ton with a 90ft. reach.

Vehicles and equipment used to perform tree services (e.g., aerial lift, wood chipper, support vehicles) shall, to the extent feasible, be positioned on paved or gravel surfaces. When it is necessary to operate vehicles or equipment on turf or on tree root

zones the service provider shall use ground protections equipment to protect soil compaction and turf damage.

Unit of Measure shall be measured by the following: Each (EA).

Payment shall be made on the basis of the unit price on the Price Worksheet.

4: ROOT REMOVAL

Description: To, without doing damage to the tree, selectively remove large surface roots starting at 3 feet out from the trunk of the tree, removing the root to the end of the nm, while never removing more than 25% of a tree's root system in any one root pruning. Shall include at least a two man crew, chipper, and large crew truck.

Unit of Measure shall be measured by the following: Each (EA).

Payment shall be made on the basis of the unit price on the Price Worksheet.

6: Site Clearing

Description: A tract of land located in right-of-ways, easements, public property and private property that may include overgrown vegetation and may include small trees (less than 6" in diameter), bushes, vines, and other vegetation obstructions which need to be removed including any significant root systems. May require use of bushhog. May require bob-cat for eath digging and/or earth to be moved.

Unit of Measure shall be measured by the following: Square Yard (SY).

Payment shall be made on the basis of the unit price on the Price Worksheet.

3.14. City Contract Requirements.

The City will enter into a Contract written by the City with the successful Service Provider that contains the terms and conditions set forth in Exhibit A. Each Service Provider must state specifically in its Proposal any exceptions to the terms and conditions included in Exhibit A, and any proposed additional telms or conditions deemed important by the Service Provider. The City will take any such exceptions and proposed additions into account during the evaluation process. Any terms and conditions that the Service Provider does not specifically object to will be incorporated into the resultant Contract. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the City reserves the right to change the proposed contractual terms and conditions prior to or during contract negotiations if it is in the City's best interest to do so.

The safety of our employees is one of our highest priorities. Our safety program consists of activities such as weekly crew visits by Area Managers, regular safety audits by the Safety Director, and weekly tailgate safety sessions. Employees obtain job specific certification within sixty days of receiving a new job assignment. All employees receive annual training in Flagging, CPR/First Aid, Electrical Hazard Awareness, and Aerial Rescue. We drug test all new hires prior to employment and existing employees on a random basis.

VI. Insurance Information



City of Charlotte Insurance Requirements and Coverage
